Local Government, Public Health, Crown Lands and Forests.

(Amendment of the Law relating to Crown Lands and Forests; Sale, Lease, Exchange, Appropriation, Enclosure, and User of Lands in Forests; Amen liment of Acts and other purpose.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act for effecting the following or some of the following purposes:—

1. To enable the Commissioners of Woods, with the consent of the Treasury, to sell, lease, exchange, appropriate, enclose, or authorize the enclosure of, or otherwise dispose of any land belonging to the Crown, and part or parcel of a Royal forest, whether enclosed, or open as waste land of such forest, for any purposes of or connected with Local Government or Public Health, or which may be of public utility or benefit, and to provide for the appropriation of any moneys arising therefrom, and so far as may be necessary to provide for the settlement of any compensation to commoners or others to arise under the exercise of the powers of the intended Act, and to provide for the application of any moneys to be paid in respect thereof.

2. So far as may be necessary for any purpose of the intended Act to repeal, alter, or amend any of the powers and provisions of the Crown Lands Acts, 1829 to 1894, the New Forest Act, 1877, and all other Acts relating to the Royal Forests,

or any of them.

3. The Act will vary or extinguish all rights, powers, and privileges which would interfere with any of its objects, and will confer other rights, powers, and privileges, and will contain all provisions necessary for or incidental to any of the purposes aforesaid.

<sup>\*</sup> Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the local inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure that officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.
