

of Saint John Dewsbury Moor all meet, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Park-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with West Park-street and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with James-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said street for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Oxford-road and with the footpath leading past the eastern side of the house and grounds called or known as West Cliff and past the south-western side of the house and grounds called or known as the Moorlands to Moorlands-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to a point on the south-western side of the last-named house upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Dewsbury Moor from the new parish of Saint Mark Dewsbury aforesaid.

“THE FIFTH SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint John Dewsbury Moor, being :—

“I. All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark Dewsbury which is bounded upon the south-east by the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist Daw Green Dewsbury upon the west by the said new parish of Saint John Dewsbury Moor and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Dewsbury Moor from the new parish of Saint Mark Dewsbury aforesaid at the point on the south-western side of the house called or known as the Moorlands as aforesaid in the middle of the footpath leading from Oxford-road into Moorlands-road as aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Moorlands-road aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark Dewsbury from the new parish of Saint John the Baptist Daw Green Dewsbury aforesaid.

“II. And also all that portion of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Batley Carr which is bounded upon the south by the said new parish of Saint Mark Dewsbury upon the west by the said new parish of Saint John Dewsbury Moor upon the north by the new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north-east by the parish of Batley in the same county and diocese and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Batley from the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr aforesaid near the junction of Halifax-road with Healds-road and extending thence to and along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eight and a half chains or thereabouts to the point where it is to be joined by a proposed new street between Healds-road and Birkdale-road and extending thence southward along the route of the proposed new street for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the point where the said proposed new street will join Birkdale-road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Batley Carr from the new parish of Saint Mark Dewsbury aforesaid.

“THE SIXTH SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Batley Carr, being :—

“All that portion of the parish of Batley aforesaid which is bounded upon the east by the said new parish of Saint Paul Hanging Heaton upon the south-east upon the south and upon the south-west by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Batley Carr upon the west by the said new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe from the parish of Batley aforesaid at a point in the middle of Track-road opposite to the western end of the wall or fence which divides the house and grounds called or known as Hyrstlands from the house and grounds called or known as Hyrst House and extending thence north-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to a point at the middle of the present northern end of Albert-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footway or passage leading into Victoria-street and extending thence north-eastward along the said footway or passage for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Victoria-street aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the footway or passage leading into King-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-described footway or passage for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with King-street aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with Cross King-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Dale-street and with the footway or passage leading into Howard-street and continuing thence still north-eastward across Dale-street aforesaid and along the middle of the last-described footway or passage for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with the present western end of Howard-street aforesaid and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of fifteen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bradford-road aforesaid and extending thence southward diagonally across the last-named road to the north-western end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the buildings and premises known as Ings Mills and extending thence south-eastward along the last-described wall or fence for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to its south-eastern end on the north-western side of the stream called Batley Beck and continuing thence still south-eastward and in a direct line to the boundary in the middle of the said stream which boundary divides the said parish of Batley from the new parish of Saint Paul Hanging Heaton aforesaid.”
