St. John's Harbour—Leading Lights and Day Marks.

THE Government of Newfoundland has given information, dated 20th January, 1902, that the positions of the leading lights and day marks for St. John's Harbour have been altered as follows:—

The lower white leading mark, carrying a fixed red light, has been moved 33 feet to the westward from its old position, and the light is now exhibited at a height of 54 feet above high water. A perpendicular white stripe will be painted on the red brick building to show the old position of the day mark and to serve as an anchorage mark.

The upper red leading light is now exhibited at an elevation of 203 feet above high water from the tower of the Congregational Church, above which rises a thin spire to a height of 255 feet above high water.

The spire of the Congregational Church in line with the white leading mark by day N. 54° W., and the two red lights in line on the same bearing by night, lead into the harbour.

The upper day mark has been discontinued.

Approximate position, lat. 47° 34' N., long. 52° 41' W.
