Special Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant of Customs in the Department of His Majesty's Customs (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870).

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

- I. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 21. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the month in which the Examination is held.
- II. Candidates must be unmarried and without family, unless they are already serving in the Customs Department.

III. No Candidate will be qualified for admission to the Examination who is less than 5 ft. 4 in. in height, or whose measurement round the chest falls short of the standard prescribed in the following table:—

For height 5 ft. 4 in. Chest girth to be 32 in. For height 5 ft. 6 in. For height 5 ft. 7 in. For height 5 ft. 8 in. Chest girth to be $33\frac{1}{2}$ in. For height 5 ft. 8 in. 5. Digesting Returns into Summaries.6. Copying Manuscript (to test accuracy).

No subjects are obligatory, but no Candidate will be regarded as qualified who fails to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency.

V. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

VI. A fee of £1 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.
