TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday, the 2nd proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 6th April.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 5th April, 1902, and will be payable at twelve months after date, viz.:—on the 5th April, 1903.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday, the 3rd proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than one o'clock, on Saturday, the 5th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

IN pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 39 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending the exception allowing employment for five hours without an interval for a meal to hosiery factories, and directing that the limitation of such exception to the period 1st November to 31st March shall not apply to such factories. So much of the existing Order as applies to hosiery factories is proposed to be repealed.
