a. Western corner of mine field will be in a position from which Calshot Castle bears S. 68° W., distant $4\frac{1}{4}$ cables.

The northern corner will be N. 63° E., $3\frac{1}{4}$ cables, from the above position.

b. Southern corner of mine field will be in a position from which Calshot Castle bears N. 79° W., distant $5\frac{1}{4}$ cables.

The eastern corner will be N. 63° E., $3\frac{1}{4}$ cables, from the above position (b).

This area should be carefully avoided by all vessels, which should keep to the deep water channel near Calshot Castle.
