LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

County of Hertford Light Railways (No. 1)
Order.

THE Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade, for confirmation under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them for the construction of a Light Railway in the Urban District of Cheshunt, in the county of Hertford.

Choléra en Arabie.

Le Ministre de l'Agriculture,

Vu l'arrêté royal du 15 juillet 1895, prescrivant des mesures sanitaires relativement à l'importation et au transit des marchandises provenant de pays ou de circonscriptions territoriales déclarées contaminées de choléra;

Vu l'existence du choléra, officiellement constaté, dans le Hedjaz,

Arrête :

ART. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 4 de l'arrêté royal du 15 juillet 1895, susvisé, sont rendues applicables, à partir du 22 courant, aux provenances du littoral arabe de la mer Rouge, compris entre Lith et Jambo, inclusivement.

ART. 2. Ces provenances, arrivant par voie de mer, seront soumises à la station sanitaire de

l'Escaut, et dans les ports d'Ostende et de Nieuport, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par le titre VIII de la Convention sanitaire internationale de Dresde.

Pesté à Brisbane et dans l'Ibea.

Le Ministre de l'Agriculture,

Vu l'arrêté royal du 5 avril 1897, relatif à la peste;

Vu l'existence de la peste, reconnue à Brisbane et officiellement constatée à Nairobi, dans le Protectorat anglais de l'Est africain,

Arrête :

ART. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 4 de l'arrêté royal du 5 avril 1897, susvisé, sont rendues applicables, à partir du 22 courant, aux provenances de Brisbane et à celles du littoral du Protectorat anglais de l'Est africain (Ibea), contaminés par la peste.

ART. 2. Ces provenances, arrivant par mer, seront soumises à la station sanitaire de l'Escaut et dans les ports d'Ostende et de Nieuport, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par les chapitres II, III et IV du règlement sanitaire général annexe à la Convention sanitaire internationale de Venise, en date du 19 mars 1897.
