Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, April 29, 1902.

NOTICE is hereby given, that His Majesty The King will hold a Levée at St. James's Palace on Monday, the 2nd June next, at *twelve* o'clock noon, and that for this and all future Levées Cards of Admission will be required, as the numbers at each of these Ceremonies must be limited.

The following are the rules to be observed :--

ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

1. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

2. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Adjutant - General at the War Office, stating clearly whether they desire to attend or to be presented; if the latter, stating by whom and on what occasion. Deputy Lieutenants of Counties will also communicate and obtain their cards from the War Office.

3. Officers of the Household Cavalry and Foot Guards on the active list will make application to the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace for cards of admission and presentation. All retired Officers of the Household Cavalry and Brigade of Guards will apply to the War Office.

4. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

5. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall.

6. Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, the Home Office, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.

7. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applications through the Secretary to the Lord Chancellor

8. Peers, Bishops, Lords Lieutenant of Counties, Members of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than eight days prior to the date of each Levée.

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THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Annexes to the new Quarantine Rules for the Russian Black Sea Coast, now come

into force, from His Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg :-

ANNEXE I to Instructions to Marine Medico-Observation Stations and Naval Quarantine establishments of the Black Sea.

- Rules for sanitary supervision over Turkish Feluccas and other foreign vessels arriving on the coast of the Black Sea at points where Quarantine and Customs establishments do not exist.

Confirmed by the Assistant Minister of the Interior on the 30th July. 1894, and forwarded with circular of the Medical Department of the 1st August, 1894. No. 5514.

1. In those cases in which a foreign vessel, in consequence of storm, injury, or any other extraordinary circumstances, shall arrive at a place where there are neither quarantine doctors nor customs establishments, the coast guard, while allowing the landing of the crew and passengers only in the case of extreme necessity, establishes strict supervision over them, not allowing them to communicate with other people, and at once gives information to the quarantine establishment, or should none such be near, to the local police authorities, who in case of need shall request the attendance of the nearest government or rural doctor for the adoption of all necessary measures in conformity with the rules of the 26th April, 1893, imperially confirmed, with a view to taking precautions against the introduction of epidemic diseases along the maritime boundaries of the Empire. The coastguard takes similar action in the event of the secret landing of a sick person, as also in the case of death of such a sick person.

2. The members of the district or rural police shall immediately notify to the coastguard the arrival on the coast of a foreign vessel, as also the landing by any vessel of a sick or dead man, and before the arrival of the coastguard they shall institute strict supervision and not allow the crew to land, with the exception of cases, in which a vessel may be in danger, and at the same time they shall speedily report to the nearest government or rural doctor, so that necessary measures may be adopted.

3. In those cases in which a Turkish felucca or other foreign vessel has been grauted the right of putting in to a place where customs and quarantine establishments do not exist, the coastguard allows the communication of such vessels with the shore only when the vessels are provided with a bill of health by one of the quarantine customs establishments.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Poor Law Conferences: Altering Regulations :

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales for the time being ;-

And to all others whom it may concern. WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the seventeenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, issued under Section 2 of the Poor Law Conferences Act, 1883, empowered the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales to pay the reason able expenses incurred in attending any Couference of Guardians held for the purpose of discussing any matter connected with the duties which devolve on them, and in purchasing reports of the proceedings of any such Conference, subject to the regulations set forth in such General

Order; And whereas it was provided by Regulation (3) of the said General Order that the maximum number of Guardians authorized to attend any Conference should be three, and that in the case of the Central Conference held in London only one Guardian should be authorized to attend from any Union at a distance of more than fifty miles from the place of meeting;

And whereas by another General Order, dated the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, We directed that the following Regulation should be substituted for the said Regulation (3) of the General Order

ized to attend any Conference shall be three, and in the case of the Central Conference held in London two Guardians only shall be authorized to attend from any Union which is situate at a distance of more than fifty miles from the place of meeting."

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made in the matter as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby rescind the said General Order, dated the second day of December, one thousand eight

hundred and ninety-seven, and Order and Direct that the said General Order dated the seventcenth day of September, one thousand eight hundredand eighty three, shall have effect as if the following Regulation were substituted therein

for Regulation (3); that is to say,— "(3.) The maximum number of Guardians authorized to attend any Conference shall be three, and in the case of the Central Conference held in London, two Guardians only shall be authorized to attend."
