NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 367 of the year 1902.)

ENGLAND—SOUTH COAST.—SPITHEAD.

Regulations in connection with Review of the Fleet on 28th June, 1902.

The Naval Commander-in-Chief at Portsmouth has, on behalf of the Admiralty, issued the following regulations to be observed by all vessels at Spithead and its vicinity on the occasion of the Review of the Fleet to be held on 28th June, 1902:—

1. In order to reduce as far as possible the chances of collision, directors of Steamship Companies, Owners of Steam vessels, Yachts, &c., are earnestly requested to give directions to the Masters of their ships to follow closely the instructions herein laid down, and to pay implicit attention to the requests of the Officers of the patrol Tugs and Boats, who will be specially charged with the duty of keeping clear the Review ground.

In the crowded condition of Spithead, navigation must be conducted with the greatest caution, and sailing vessels and small craft must remember that large steamships will not always be able to give way to them.

2. All steam vessels present are requested to burn the best Welsh coal, so that smoke may not obstruct the view of the Fleet nor cause danger of collision. Vessels neglecting to follow this rule will be removed to a distance.

3. During the 26th, 27th, 29th, and 30th June, and on the 28th June, previous to the hour fixed for the Review, private steam vessels, steam yachts, and sailing vessels are to be permitted to pass between the columns under the following regulations:—

(See plan of the position of the Fleet, published by the Admiralty, to be had of all sellers of Admiralty Charts.)

a. The course of vessels through the different columns of ships-of-war is to be as follows:—

Between lines B and C, by small vessels only proceeding westward.

Between lines C and D, by all vessels proceeding eastward.

Between lines D and E, by all vessels proceeding westward.

Between lines E and F, by all vessels proceeding eastward.

South of line F will be left for general traffic, which must follow the rule of the road, *i.e.*, keeping to their own starboard side of the channel, except between 6 A.M. on the 28th June and 4 A.M. on 29th June, when this water is to be used for vessels proceeding to the westward only.

The number of vessels anchored at Spithead south of the lines of the ships-of-war on the night of the 28th June, will make it very dangerous for mail steamers to attempt to pass to and from Southampton by the eastern route, and the Needles channel should be used in consequence.

b. The speed of steam vessels when within the columns is to be limited to 5 knots.

c. Whilst between the columns vessels are not to pass one another, and no vessel is to stop unless to avoid collision.

d. Should the strength of the wind or other circumstances render it undesirable that long ships should pass through the columns, the ships-of-war at the eastern and western ends will hoist a blue ensign at one of the mast heads, which will indicate that no ship over 400 feet in length is to pass through the columns, and any such ship must then pass south of Ryde Middle.

Should the ship be dressed, the blue ensign will take the place of one of the white ensigns ordinarily displayed.

4. While the Fleet is at Spithead all vessels within the limits of the Port when altering course or stopping are to make use of the sound signals mentioned in clause 19 of the Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions, *viz.*:—

When altering course to starboard, one short blast.

When altering course to port, two short blasts. When engines are going astern, three short blasts.

5. After 30^m past Noon on 28th June (on a signal gun being fired from His Majesty's Ship "London") no private steam vessel is to enter the Review ground, and all vessels and boats are to be clear of the lines by 1^h 30^m P.M.

6. The Review ground is to be considered to be the space not otherwise allotted for merchant and private ships' anchorage. See Special Chart.

Vessels are on no account to encroach to the eastward of the line appointed for anchorage of large steamships north of Ryde Middle. This will be very strictly enforced.

7. The approaches to the Review ground from Cowes south of Ryde Middle, and from the south-eastward, and also Portsmouth Harbour channel, are to be kept clear of vessels and boats, and no vessel under any circumstances is to anchor in these approaches.

8. The anchorage reserved for large Merchant steamers (except those to which numbered berths are assigned), will be to the northward of Ryde Middle, extending east to the limit shown by the

line on the published plan. Vessels anchoring in the eastern part of this area will anchor in one of the positions marked on the Special Chart and in no other.

9. Small vessels must anchor upon or close to the Mother Bank, Ryde Middle, Horse and Dean Sands, or in Stokes Bay, except on the Horse Sand in places assigned to vessels on special list. See Special Chart.

10. During the time the King is reviewing the Fleet, no steam vessel, sailing vessel, or boat will be permitted to cross the line of the ships-of-war, nor pass between the columns, nor follow the procession of Royal Yachts.

11. When the Review is over, which will be indicated by a gun fired by each of the Flagships some time after His Majesty's Yacht has anchored, steam vessels will be again permitted to pass through the columns in the same direction as before, but must return to their prescribed anchorages by 8.30 P.M., in time to witness the illuminations, and in order to avoid the danger from the salutes of the Fleet.

12. Between 9 P.M. on 28th June and 3 A.M. 29th June no vessel is to be under way in the Review Ground, with the following exception:—Vessels of not more than 200 feet in length will be permitted to pass between the columns when the ships are illuminated in the directions prescribed in paragraph 3. All such ships must, however, be clear of the lines between 11 P.M. and midnight. During that period there will be first an interval of darkness, and later a salute, both of which may make navigation dangerous.

13. While the Fleet is at Spithead, the Torpedo Boat Destroyers occupying berths immediately east and west of the night leading line through the Swashway, will from sunset to sunrise exhibit *two fixed white lights* vertically, to indicate the passage.

14. Great caution must be observed by the smaller steam vessels and sailing craft entering the main channel to Portsmouth Harbour from the Swashway.

15. Masters of vessels under way after sunset are reminded of the necessity of having in readiness a lantern to wave at the stern to an overtaking ship.

16. Masters of vessels are reminded that for some time before the Review, a large number of buoys marking the position of ships' berths will be laid down between the Isle of Wight and the mainland, which are to be carefully avoided.

NOTE.—Nothing in this Notice is to be construed as absolving vessels from closely observing the provisions of the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea."

FLEETWOOD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL (Construction of New Outfall and other Sewers and Pumping Station; acquisition of Lands, Compulsorily or by Agreement; Easements over or under Lands; Additional Lands for Pumping Station; further Borrowing Powers for Sewage Purposes; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Urban District Council of Fleetwood, in the county of Lancaster (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), intend to apply to Parliament for leave to introduce a Bill in the present Session for the following or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Council to make and maintain in the Urban District of Fleetwood, in the county of Lancaster, the following works or some or one of them, with all necessary and proper tanks, storage and subsidiary sewers, outfalls, works and conveniences (that is to say):—

(1.) An outfall sewer (No. 1) commencing in Dock-street by a junction with the existing sewer of the Council at the intersection of that street with Albert-street, thence passing under and along Dock-street, Lower Dock-street, Cop-lane, Styant-street, West-street, Radcliffe-road, Belmont-road, Park-avenue, thence through and under lands belonging to and occupied by the Fleetwood Estate Limited, and terminating on the foreshore at a point 403 yards from the western boundary of the field numbered 21 on the 2500 inch Ordnance Map (first edition, 1891) of the parish and township of Fleetwood.

(2.) An outfall sewer (No. 2) commencing at or in the pumping station hereinafter described, and terminating on the shore or bed of the sea at a point 657 yards or thereabouts measured in a north-westerly direction from Rossall Land Mark.

(3.) An outfall sewer (No. 3) commencing by a junction with outfall sewer No. 1 hereinafter described, in the said field No. 21 on the 2500 inch Ordnance Map of the said parish, and terminating in the pumping station hereinafter described.

(4.) A pumping station with an approach thereto to be situate in the said field numbered 21 on the 2500 inch Ordnance Map of the said parish, and on land hereinafter described, and thereafter maintain and use and manage all necessary and proper erections, appliances, tanks, wells, basins, pumping and other engines, mains, buildings, machinery, apparatus, works, and conveniences for receiving, pumping, and conveying the sewage of the district.

2. To authorize the Council, in connection with the said intended works before described, to make and maintain all necessary approaches, retaining

walls, embankments, subsidiary sewers, tanks, bridges, arches, drains, culverts, excavations, and other works and conveniences.

3. To authorize the Council to deviate in the construction of the intended sewers and works both vertically and laterally, to the extent shown on the deposited plans and sections or to be defined by the Bill or prescribed by Parliament.

4. To enable the Council for all or any of the purposes of the Bill to appropriate and use any lands for the time being belonging to them, and to purchase or otherwise acquire compulsorily or by agreement lands (including in that expression where used in this notice, easements and other property) for the purposes of the intended sewers and other works, and the Bill will or may seek power to enable the Council to purchase compulsorily such easements in, under or over lands and property, as may be requisite for the said works, without purchasing the land over the same, and to appropriate and use the subsoil and under-surface of any street, subject to such conditions as the Bill may prescribe, and to enable the Council, in addition to the lands to be acquired for, and in connection with the before-mentioned sewers and works, to acquire and take compulsorily, or by agreement, or take on lease the following lands for the before-mentioned pumping station, viz. :—

Certain lands in the said parish and township of Fleetwood, situate in the said field numbered 21 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ inch Ordnance Map, and containing by admeasurement twelve hundred superficial yards or thereabouts, and belonging to or reputed to belong to the Fleetwood Estate Limited, and on such lands to construct the before-mentioned pumping station, with all necessary buildings, tanks, engines, and machinery therefor.

5. To empower the Council to deepen so much of the bed of the sea and foreshore as may be necessary for the purposes of the proposed works, and to appropriate and dispose of all substances so obtained.

6. To empower the Council to construct such improvements and extensions of and additions to the existing and proposed sewers and works as the Council may from time to time deem necessary, and to construct such subsidiary works as they may deem advisable.

7. To authorize the Council to make junctions or connections with roads, streets, sewers, and drains, and if necessary to alter the levels thereof, and to remove, alter, or interfere with sewers, drains, gas, water, and other mains and pipes, telegraph, telephone, or other electrical apparatus.

8. To empower the Council to make in any streets, roads, footways and thoroughfares, all such alterations of levels and width of roadway and footway as may be expedient for or in connection with the construction of the said works, and to use, break up, stop up, alter, divert and interfere with, either permanently or temporarily (and if permanently to appropriate the site and soil of and to extinguish all rights of way over), and to cross over, under, or upon such streets, highways, bridges, thoroughfares, railways, tramways, rivers, navigations, canals, streams, brooks, watercourses, sewers, drains, gas and water and other pipes, and telegraphic, telephonic, and electric apparatus as it may be necessary or convenient, to stop up, alter, divert, interfere with, or cross for any of the purposes of the Bill, and to extinguish all rights of way, manorial, and other rights in, over, or upon any lands to be acquired under or by virtue of the powers of the Bill.

9. To vest in the Council all sewers and works constructed by them under the powers of the intended Act.

10. To enable the Council for or in relation to all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and also for or in relation to the purposes of the Acts and Orders relating to the Council or the District to apply their rates, funds, and revenues, and any moneys which they are already authorized to borrow, and to make, assess, levy, and recover new and additional tolls, rates, and charges, and to borrow further moneys by mortgage, and to charge these moneys upon the general improvement rate, lands, tenements, hereditaments, undertakings, and property, and the rates, rents, tolls, and revenues of the Council, acting as an Urban Sanitary Authority, and to make provisions with respect to the repayment of any moneys to be borrowed under the powers of the Bill.

11. The Bill will or may enable the Council to carry the provisions of the Bill into effect with, under, and subject to the powers and provisions of the Public Health Acts, the Local Government Acts, the Lands Clauses Acts, the Local Loans Act, the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and other Acts (public or local) affecting urban sanitary authorities, with such modifications as may be contained in the Bill, and to enter into and fulfil agreements and contracts for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and the Bill will or may confirm any such agreements and contracts which may have been or which may be entered into during the progress of the Bill.

12.
