Cadiz, January 14.

THE Conde d'Agular is gone for Madrid; Don Pedro Cornette is to command the Fleet in his place; and Don Honorato Bonifacio Papaciano is made Vice-Admiral. On the Seventh Instant arrived here in Sixteen days from the *St. Alban*. Captain Fitzpatrick Commander, the *Deptford* Captain Carr, and the *Crown* Captain Warren, with a small Prize laden with China Goods. This week were cast away on these Coasts 11 Gallies, but the Men saved. The Indulto being ended, the Gallies begin to unlade.

Milan, Febr. 13. The Marquis de Loganez, our Governor-General, accompanied by the Count de Lamoyne Maître de Camp General, and other principal Officers, parted from hence towards the end of the last month to view the Garison and Fortifications at *Final*. The Duke of Savoy repaired thither about the same time from *Mondou*, and having had a Conference with his Excellency about the present state of Affairs, they went together to *Savona*, where they embarked the next day on the Admiral Galleys of the Duke of Turis's Squadron, attended by 3 other Gallies belonging to the State of *Genova*, and arrived at *Genova* the 4th Instant; At their coming in they were saluted with a discharge of all the Cannon from the Forts and the Gallies and Ships that were in that Port; and the Envoy of Spain, with Prince *Doria*, and divers other Persons of Quality went off to meet and Compliment his Royal Highness; and the Senate Deputed 12 of their Body to wait upon him, but his Royal Highness excused himself from receiving their Compliment, desiring to be *incognito*. The Duke of Savoy and our Governor were lodged in the Palace of the Duke of *St. Pierre*. The next day his Excellency left *Genova*, and arrived here on the 10th; and his Royal Highness after having seen the Curiosities of that City, intended to return to *Turin* by the way of *Savona* and *Mondou*. His Excellency has since his coming back ordered a Reinforcement of 600 Men to be sent to *Final*.

Venice, Febr. 15. The French Envoy, the Count de Raknac, is arrived here from *Rome*, but does not yet appear publicly. From *Dalmatia* we have an account, that the Turks had lately made an attempt upon the Fort of *Nicovich*, but were beaten off with great loss. The Senate have sent an Express to *Germany* to acquaint the Baron *Vander-Lippe* with the Choice they have made of him to be General of their Land Forces, and to desire him to hasten hither. Our preparations for the War go on very vigorously.

Javaros, Febr. 1. The King of Poland will leave this place the beginning of the next week, and go with the whole Court to *Lemberg*, where he purposes to pass the Carnival. *Mustapha* Aga, who was taken Prisoner at the late defeat of the Turkish Convoy (which he commanded) near *Sorocke*, was brought hither two days ago. A considerable Body of Tartars lies now encamped near *Caminiec*, and some of their Parties have, notwithstanding the extreme Cold Weather, entered into the Province of *Pacuzia*, about *Halizia*, and *Stanisluia*, where they burnt several Villages, and carried away many of the Inhabitants into Slavery: A Detachment of our Troops was upon the first notice thereof sent in pursuit of the Enemy, but could not overtake them, except some Straglers whom they made Prisoners. 'Tis confirmed that the Hospodar of *Mol-*

davia has caused his Chancellor, and the General of his Forces, with several others of his chief Officers, to be put to death, upon his having discovered some Practices which they were carrying on in favour of the Crown of *Poland*; And that he was preparing, with the assistance he expected from the Turks and Tartars, to attack the Poles who are possessed of several places in his Country.

Vienna, Febr. 24. The Preparations for the next Campagne are carried on in all the Hereditary Countries with great diligence and application; and all the Officers are ordered to have their Troops compleat by the beginning of *May* on pain of being cashiered. Prince *Louis* of *Baden*, who intended to set out from *Prague* on the 19th Instant, is expected here in few days to assist at the Consultations that will be held in the Emperor's presence about the Affairs of the War. The Turkish Troops that assembled lately near *Temeswaer*, with a design, as they gave out, to succor *Great-Waradin*, finding the execution of it was made impracticable as well by the badness of the Weather, as the Watchful Eye the Imperialists had upon their Motions, are separated again, and returned to their several Quarters; The news of which will doubtless very much increase the Consternation the Turks at *Great-Waradin* are already in; and as it must take from them all the hopes they still flattered themselves with of being speedily relieved, so it will in all probability convince them of the folly of their obstinacy, and make them prefer an honourable Capitulation, which they may yet obtain, to the great Miseries they suffer, without any prospect of saving the place. Colonel *Antonio* has with the Radziens under his Command made an Excursion lately into the Enemies Countrey, and advanced within some few miles of *Belgrade*, where he burnt several Villages, and brought back a great Booty. All the Advices from *Constantinople* and *Adrianople* speak of the great preparations which the Turks make for this next Campagne in *Hungary*.

Ratisbonne, Febr. 24. The Prince de Lobcomits, the Emperors chief Commissioner, arrived here about a fortnight ago; On the 14th he presented his Credentials to the Dyet, and the next day was Complimented by a solemn Deputation on the part of all the Princes and States of the Empire; and these with some other previous Ceremonies being performed with mutual satisfaction, he has since begun to enter upon the Functions of his Commission. The Elector of *Bavaria* returned to *Municken* on the 18th Instant from *Vienna*; The 22d the States were to meet there; and on the 2d of the next month his Electoral Highness intends to set forward on his Journey towards *Flanders*. The Deputies of the Circle of *Suabia* that assembled lately at *Ulm* are separated, after having resolved to raise a new Regiment of Foot to consist of 1800 Men, and to make up those they have already in their service to the same number; and of this they have given notice to the States of *Franconia* assembled at *Nuremberg*.

Paris, March 1. The French King's departure for *Compeigne* continues fixed for the Third of this Month; but 'tis said at Court, that 'twill be only a Journey of eight or nine days. The Sieur de *Fauban*, and the Sieur de *Megrigny*, our two principal Engineers, are ordered for *Flanders*, but we yet hear nothing of the Duke

Duke of Luxemburg's going thither, who is said to be discontinued at the Marquis de Bouffler's being made Colonel of the Regiment of French Guards. The two Companies of Musketeers, which are made up to 300 each, are to be divided into 4 Squadrons; whereof two are to go to the Army; and the other two to follow the Court. The Count d'Estree parted from hence the 23d of the last Month for *Toulon*, to command the French Squad on in the *Mediterranean*. The French King came thither on the 26th past to put the Duke of Chartres in possession of the Palace Royal, and returned in the Evening to *Versailles*. The Abbot d'Estree prepares for his Embassy to *Portugal*.

Brussels, March 7. We have an account from *Namur* by Letters of the 1st Instant, that a great Convoy consisting of 7 Pieces of great Cannon, and above 200 Wagons laden with Provisions and Ammunition, was arrived there from *Mastricht*, having been conducted by Count *Serclaes de Tilly*, General of the Forces of *Liege*, with 3000 Horse and 1000 Foot as far as *Burdine*, and from thence to *Namur* by a strong Detachment commanded by the Count de *Nassau* Major General of the Dutch Troops, who commands those that are in that Garrison. On the 28th past a strong Party from *Mons* appeared near *Graumont* and *Engkien*, but they quickly retired again, having only taken 8 Horses, and plundered some Houses at *Goycke*. We hear from *Mons*, that they have there a great Train of Artillery ready to march, as it was designed for some Enterprize; and that a great quantity of Ammunition, Bombs, and Carcasses was brought thither from *Valenciennes*. We are preparing for the Reception of the Elector of *Bavaria* who is expected here about the middle of this month.

Edinburgh, Febr. 25. This Evening three Regiments of Foot, viz. the Earl of *Leven's*, Colonel *Lowther's*, and Colonel *Beveridge's* set sail for *Flanders*. The Earl of *Argyle* is expected here in order to embark about the middle of the next Month.

Newcastle, Febr. 26. On Friday last about 100 Sail of laden Colliers sailed out of *Tinmouth* Haven with their Convoy; and this morning the remainder of the Fleet, being about 50 Sail, intended to sail likewise under the Convoy of the *Sweepstakes*.

Whitehaven, Febr. 21. This day arrived here part of Major General *Ruygny's* Regiment of Horse from *Ireland*.

Chester, Febr. 25. Since my last Colonel *Schecks* Regiment of Horse, and Colonel *Richards's* Fusiliers, are landed here from *Ireland*.

Falmouth, Febr. 25. Yesterday in the Evening came before this Harbour Their Majesty's Ship the *Chester* and about 25 Sail of Transport Ships with Danish Soldiers from *Ireland*, and the Wind coming N. W. they are now going to Sea again. The Spanish Expedition sailed yesterday for the *Grays*, having on Board the Baron de *Boingarden* Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Bavaria*.

Piimonth, Febr. 26. On Wednesday last arrived here Their Majesty's Ships the *Saphire* and *Chatham* from *Bilboa*; where they left the *Pearl* Frigate with the Merchant Ships that went out under their Convoy. Their Majesty's Ships the *Monke* and the *Success* with the Merchant men that sailed hence with them, were put back yesterday by contrary Winds, but came not to an Anchor, for the Wind changing they sailed again in the same day to the *Wardward*. The last night came in the *Chester* with the rest of the *Danes* from *Scilly*.

Portsmouth, March 1. On Sunday last sailed from *Spithead* to the Eastward a Dutch Man of War, and 4 Dutch Capers, with several Prizes they have taken from the French. Their Majesty's Ships the *Staring-Castle* and the *Lenox* intend to set sail this day for the *Buoy* of the *Nore*.

Dunle, March 1. Their Majesty's Ships the *Mane* and the *Success* are come into the *Downes* with Colonel *Earle's* Regiment of Foot, and divers Merchantmen from *Piimonth*.

Whitehall, March 1. This day the Right Honourable *Laurence Earl of Rochester*, *Richard Earl of Rineclagh*, *Charles Lord Cornwallis*, and *Sir Edward Seymour* Bar. were Sworn of Their Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, and accordingly took their places at the Board. And

The Right Honourable *William Earl of Bedford* took the usual Oaths as Lord Lieutenant of the County of *Middlesex*.

His Majesty has been pleased to constitute the Right Honourable *Thomas Earl of Pembroke* Lord Keeper of Their Majesty's Privy Seal; which His Majesty delivered to his Lordship this day.

The Right Honourable *Charles Lord Cornwallis* is appointed by His Majesty to be Commissioner

of the Admiralty in the place of the Earl of *Pembroke*.

The Right Honourable *Sir Edward Seymour* Bar. and *Charles Mountague* Esq; are constituted by His Majesty Commissioners of Their Majesty's Treasury in the places of *Sir John Lowther* of *Lowther* Bar. Vice Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household, and *Thomas Pelham* Esq; who have resigned the same.
