WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Sheffield) Order, 1902.

Dated 3rd July, 1902.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the Council of the City of Sheffield, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City of Sheffield) Order, 1902."

BIRDS.

*Close Time Extended.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in each year.

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Song Thrush, Redstart, Whitethroat, Garden Warbler, Chiff Chaff, Willow Warbler, Wood

Warbler, Longtailed Tit, Great Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Crested Tit, Nuthatch, Tree-creeper, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Swallow, House Martin, Sand Martin, Greenfinch, Chaffinch, Crossbill, Yellowhammer, Gull Bunting, White Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Swift, Marsh Harrier, Hobby, Osprey, Turtle Dove, Moor Hen.

*Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield:—

Missel Thrush, Ring Ouzel, Stonechat, Robin, Nightingale, Hedge Sparrow, Black Cap, Golden Crested Wren, Longtailed Tit, Great Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Crested Tit, Tree-creeper, Wren, Dipper, White Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Tree Pipit, Meadow Pipit, Skylark, Woodlark, Swift, Night-jar, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Green Woodpecker, Wryneck, Kingfisher, Barn Owl, Longeared Owl, Shorteared Owl, Tawny Owl, Jay, Magpie, Redbacked Shrike, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Swallow, House Martin, Sand Martin, Greenfinch, Hawfinch, Goldfinch, Tree Sparrow, Chaffinch, Linnet, Mealy Redpole, Lesser Redpole, Twite, Bullfinch, Buzzard, Sparrow Hawk, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Merlin, Kestrel, Osprey, Common Heron, Turtle-dove, Green Sandpiper, Common Sandpiper, Redshank, Blackheaded Gull.

*All Birds protected on Sundays.*

V. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield.

EGGS.

*Certain Eggs protected throughout the Year.*

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Sheffield:—

Song Thrush, Blackbird, Ring Ouzel, Wheatear, Whinchat, Redstart, Robin, Nightingale, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Garden Warbler, Blackcap, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Chiff Chaff, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Common Sand Piper, Redshank, Longtailed Tit, Great Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Marsh Tit, Crested Tit, Nuthatch, Dipper, Spotted Flycatcher, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Linnet, Crossbill, Gull Bunting, Grey Wagtail, Skylark, Woodlark, Nightjar, Curlew, Great Crested Grebe, Kingfisher, White Owl, Longeared Owl, Shorteared Owl, Tawny Owl, Marsh Harrier, Hen Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, Osprey, Common Heron, Wild Duck, Landrail, Spotted Crake, Golden Plover, Woodcock, Common Snipe, Little Grebe.
