Strong Guards are placed on all our Canals and Sluces, and at Liere, Arschot, Diest, Tirlemont, Lieuwe, and St. Tron; and the Troops of Holland and Brandenburgh, that are quartered about Burguesopom, Boldue, and Maissiricht, and in the Country of Leige, have Orders to advance this way. The Enemy at the same time continue their Preparations: they have a great Train of Artillery at Maifricht, and in the Country of Leige, have Orders to advance this way.
