The following Address was presented to His Majesty at Portsmouth, on board the Royal Yacht "Victoria and Albert," on the 14th instant:—

To Their Most Gracious Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

May it please Your Majesties,
We, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of
the Borough of Portsmouth, desire, on the
Coronation of Your Majesties, to assure You of
the loyalty and devotion of the inhabitants of this
borough to Yourselves and Family, and to offer
our sincere wish that Your Majesties may have
a long and prosperous reign. The deep interest
which has always been taken by Your Majesties
and Family in all matters affecting Your people
and the various public bodies and institutions is
well known, and is responded to by the general
loyalty and devotion of the inhabitants in all
parts of the Empire, and, although the duties and
responsibilities of Your Majesties, consequent on
Your accession to the Throne of England, are,
and will be heavy and onerous, Your Majesties
may rest assured of the loyalty and support
of Your people.

In common with Your Majesties' subjects, we have shared the deepest anxiety during His Majesty The King's recent illness, and rejoice in His restoration to health.

We also desire most heartily to congratulate Your Majesties on the restoration of peace in South Africa, and trust that the blessings of peace may soon be felt in that country, and the welfare and prosperity of its people be restored.
