Akrey Reef—Bell Buoy Established.

The Danish Government has given notice, dated 17th September, 1902, that the red buoy with staff and broom, situated near the north end of the reef extending off Akrey Island, has been replaced by a bell buoy.

Engey—Light Exhibited.

The Danish Government has given notice, dated 17th September, 1902, that a fixed white light has been established on the north-west

point of Engey Island, Reykjavik approach. The light, exhibited at an elevation of 32 feet above the level of the sea, from a lamp-post, should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles. It will be shown annually from 1st September to 15th October, and from 1st March to 30th April.
