EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

The Board of Trade have received from His Majesty's Representative at New Orleans the following copy of a Circular issued by the Louisiana State Board of Health respecting quarantine at that port:—

New Orleans, September 13, 1902.

Gentlemen,

Your attention is respectfully called to the following resolutions adopted at the Meeting of the Louisiana State Board of Health held September 2, 1902:—

"Resolved, that on and after Tuesday, October 15, detention after disinfection will be imposed only on vessels from ports actually infected, or which have had on board cases of quarantinable diseases, or cases suspected of being such. Passengers from healthy fruit ports to be released immediately after disinfection of baggage on and after that date, provided all are well.

"Resolved, that His Excellency, the Governor of Louisiana, be requested to withdraw his Proclamation of Quarantine of March 6, 1902*, except as same refers to ports and places infected, or suspected of being infected, with bubonic plague and Asiatic cholera, such withdrawal to take effect on and after November 1, 1902."

In accordance with the request of the State Board of Health the Governor of Louisiana issued his Proclamation, September 10, withdrawing quarantine on and after November 1, 1902, except in so far as it refers and applies to ports and places infected, or suspected of being infected with bubonic plague and Asiatic cholera.
