

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 23RD OCTOBER 1902.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation of Orders.

1. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected

Areas) Order of 1896 and either of the Orders described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and two.

Stradbroke Island—Shoal Reported Eastward of.

The Government of the State of Queensland has given notice, date 22nd August, 1902, that the Master of the steamship "Konoowarra" reports the existence of a shoal, with a depth of 3 fathoms over it, situated about 1¼ miles from the coast near Swan Bay, and about 17½ miles to the southward of Lookout Point.

No. 748.—WESTERN AUSTRALIA—GEOGRAPHE BAY.

Koombanah Bay—Light Established.

The Government of the State of Western Australia has given notice that, on 1st October, 1902, a green fixed light, elevated 44 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 7 miles, would be established on the outer extremity of the finished portion of the mole extending from Casuarina Point, Koombanah Bay.

Approximate position, lat. 33° 18' S., long. 115° 39¼' E.

The light is dioptric of the 5th order.
