## No. 750.—INDIA—WEST COAST.

*Porbandar—Light Discontinued.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 82 of 1899:—

The Government of India has given further notice, dated 17th September, 1902, that the red fixed light formerly exhibited from the tower of the Administrator's House, Porbandar, has been discontinued.

Approximate position, lat. 21° 37½' N., long. 69° 37' E.

## No. 751.—FRANCE—WEST COAST.

*Rochebonne Plateau—Marks Withdrawn.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 402 of 1902:—

The French Government has given further notice, dated 7th October, 1902, that the construction of the lighthouse on La Congr e, Rochebonne Plateau, having been temporarily suspended, the following marks have been withdrawn:—

a. The white conical buoys marking the area of the works.

b. The hulk with two masts painted red, with Rochebonne on each side, which at night exhibited only the lights of a vessel at anchor, moored about 1½ miles N.N.E. of La Congr e Rock.

c. The small steam vessel and two lighters, carrying anchor lights, moored during the night about one mile N.E. of La Congr e.

Approximate position of La Congr e, lat. 46° 12' N., long. 2° 25¼' W.

[Variation 16° Westerly in 1902.]

Note.—The Pontoon light-vessel and the light-buoys are unaltered.

## No. 752.—FRANCE—WEST COAST.

*Chauss e de Sein—Buoy replaced by Light Buoy.*

The French Government has given notice, dated 2nd October, 1902, that the conical buoy, painted in white and black horizontal bands, with two cones, bases together, as a topmark, marking the western extremity of Chauss e de Sein, has been replaced experimentally by a light-buoy coloured in the same manner, exhibiting a white fixed light, and moored about three-quarters of a mile to the westward of the position of the former buoy.

Approximate position, lat. 48° 3¼' N., long. 5° 6½' W.
