The KING has been pleased to approve of the re-appointment of Nicholas Julian Paterson, Esq., to be an Unofficial Member of the Legislative Council of the Island of Grenada.

Foreign Office, November 14, 1902.

It is hereby notified that His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs received a despatch, dated the 11th July last, from His Majesty's Minister at Carácas, transmitting a Decree of the Venezuelan Government, which appeared in the Official Gazette of the 28th June, and was formally communicated to him on the following day. This Decree prohibited the navigation of the waters of the Orinoco, and declared the line of coast which embraces its mouths blockaded, and the ports of Guiria and Caño Colorado closed to commerce and navigation. The port of La Vela de Coro was also declared to be blockaded.

His Majesty's Minister subsequently reported that, by a later Decree which appeared in the Official Gazette of the 19th July, the port of Carupano was included in the above blockade. This Decree was, however, revoked by a third

Decree, dated the 23rd August.

His Majesty's Government have ascertained from the reports of His Majesty's Minister at Carácas, from those of the Senior Naval Officer of His Majesty in those waters, and from other trustworthy sources, that no effective blockade of the stretch of coast and ports comprised in the Decrees of the 28th June and the 19th July is, or has ever been, maintained. It is, therefore, further notified that the blockade so declared is held by His Majesty's Government to be, and to have been, ab initio, null and of no effect.

## WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Gloucester) Order, 1902.

Dated 14th November, 1902.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Gloucester, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Gloucester) Order, 1902."

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the County of Gloucester, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of November in each year:—

Redpole, Hoopoe, Short Eared Owl, Wood-peckers.

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall not apply within the County of Gloucester to the House Sparrow.

# Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Gloucester:—

Goldfinch, Long Eared Owl, Ring Ouzel, Dipper (Water Ouzel), Kingfisher, Stone Curlew, Nightjar, Buzzards, Woodlark, Siskin, Great Grey Shrike, Bittern, Great Snipe (Solitary Snipe),

Cirl Bunting.
