NOTICES TO MARINERS.

[The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.]

No. 835.—BRITISH COLUMBIA—QUEEN CHARLOTTE SOUND.

*New Channel—Rocks.*

Information, dated 25th October, 1902, has been received from Commander C. H. Simpson, H.M. surveying vessel *Egeria*, of the existence of the undermentioned rocks in New Channel, Queen Charlotte's Sound:—

(a) A rock, awash at low-water springs and marked by kelp, situated with Race Island bearing N. 70° E., distant 9½ cables, and the western extremity of Staples Island N. 27° W.

Approximate position, lat. 50° 52½' N., long. 127° 33' W.

(b) A rocky head, one mile south eastward of the above, with a depth of 4¾ fathoms over it at low water, situated with White Rock bearing N. 32° E., distant 5½ cables, and the western extremity of Staples Island N. 46° W.

[Variation 25° Westerly in 1902.]

No. 836.—EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO—WETTA PASSAGE.

*Babi or Liban—Intended Light.*

The Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 8th November, 1902, that during 1903 a white flashing light, every five seconds, elevated 220 feet above high water, and visible in clear

weather from a distance of 20 miles, will be established in an iron framework tower, having a white dwelling with red roof at its base, erected on the southern point of Babi or Liban (Liran) Island.

Approximate position on Chart No. 942*a*, lat. 8° 3' S., long. 125° 45' E.

No. 837.—EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO—SERWATTI ISLANDS.

*Brisbane Islet (Maety Mirang)—Intended Light.*

The Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 8th November, 1902, that during 1903 it is intended to establish a white group flashing light, showing two short flashes in quick succession every ten seconds, at an elevation of 75 feet above high water, in an iron framework tower, painted white, having a white dwelling with red roof at its base, erected on Brisbane Islet or Maety Mirang.

The light will be of the 5th order.

Approximate position on Chart No. 942*a*, lat. 8° 21' S., long. 128° 30½' E.
