SOMERSET AND DISTRICT ELECTRIC POWER.

(Incorporation of Company; Power to Establish Generating Stations and Works and Supply Electricity, &c., in parts of the Counties of Somerset, Gloucester, and Wilts, and the City and County of Bristol; Compulsory Taking and User of Lands, Roads, &c.; Construction of Bridge; Breaking-up of Streets; Power to lay down Wires, Pipes, &c., and Exercise of other Powers; Rates, Charges, &c.; Provisions as to Supply; Agreements with and Powers to Local Authorities, Companies, and Bodies; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts, &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for effecting all or some of the purposes following (that is to say):—

To incorporate a Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for the purpose of establishing and carrying on electric works for and generating, producing, and supplying electric energy or power and doing all things necessary for or ancillary to that purpose and generally for the purposes of the Bill.

To empower the Company to enter upon, take, and use compulsorily or otherwise and to hold amongst other lands the lands in the counties of Somerset and Gloucester hereinafter mentioned or some of them, or some part or parts thereof respectively, and any estates, rights, or interests in or easements over or in connection with the same (that is to say):—

The property in the parish of Hanham Abbots in the rural district of Warmley, in the county of Gloucester, being the whole of the lands numbered 86 and 88, and part of the lands numbered 89, 90 and 190 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map of Gloucester (1882 edition, sheet LXXVI, 2) containing 29 acres or thereabouts, bounded on the north (starting from the Hanham Common-lane) by the property of the Hanham Colliery Company and that Company's tramway, on the west by the towing path of the River Avon, on the south by an imaginary straight line drawn from a point measured along the said towing path in a southerly direction 800 feet or thereabouts from the westerly termination of the said tramway, in an easterly direction to Hanham Common-lane, and on the east by Hanham Common-lane aforesaid to the starting point, but excluding from such eastern boundary the land and buildings shown on the said Ordnance Map and numbered 85 thereon.

The property in the urban district of Radstock, in the county of Somerset, being the whole of the lands numbered 212 and 214 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map of Somerset (1886 edition, sheet XX, 15) containing $8\frac{1}{4}$ acres or thereabouts, bounded on the north by the Somerset and Dorset Joint Railway, on the east by the lands proposed to be used by the Radstock District Council for sewage works, on the south by the River Somer, and on the west by the wagon works of Messrs. Wheeler and Gregory Limited.

A plot of land in the said urban district of Radstock, being part of the enclosure numbered 215 on the above Ordnance Map of Somerset, bounded on the north by the River Somer, on the east by land belonging to the Earl of Waldegrave, on the south by the occupation road shown on the said plot of land, and on the west by land also belonging to the Earl of Waldegrave, such western boundary terminating at an imaginary straight line drawn in a northerly direction at a point on the said occupation road, distant 300 feet or thereabouts from the bridge leading over the River Somer to the wagon works of the said Messrs. Wheeler and Gregory Limited, and containing three-quarters of an acre or thereabouts.

To empower the Company to erect and maintain, according to the lines and levels shown on the deposited plans and sections, a bridge over the River Somer to connect the lastly hereinbefore described lands, numbered 214 and 215 on the aforesaid Ordnance Map of Somerset, and for such purpose to carry out all necessary works and to interfere with the bed and foreshore of the River Somer.

And to empower the Company upon all or any of such lands and premises, or any part thereof respectively, to erect, maintain, work, and use a station or stations for producing, generating, using, transforming, transmitting, conveying, and distributing electrical energy or power, and any material product, matter, or thing arising or used in the process of such generation or transformation, with all necessary dynamos, batteries, accumulators, storage, motors, generators, engines, plant, machinery, works, buildings, appliances, apparatus, and conveniences for that purpose, and to produce, generate, transform, transmit, convey, store, use, and distribute such energy, power, materials, products, matters, and things, and to supply and distribute the same to and within the following limits, or some part or parts thereof (that is to say):—

In those parts of the counties of Somerset, Gloucester and Wilts, and the city and county of Bristol hereinafter described, namely:—

In the county of Somerset:—The city and county borough of Bath, the city and municipal borough of Wells, the municipal borough of Glastonbury, the urban districts of Radstock, Midsomer Norton, Shepton Mallet, Frome and Street, and the rural districts of Frome, Shepton Mallet, Wells, Bath, Keynsham, and Clutton.

In the county of Gloucester:—The urban districts of Horfield and Kingswood, and the rural districts of Warmley and Barton Regis, and the parish of Pucklechurch in the rural district of Chipping Sodbury.

The whole of the city and county of Bristol.

In the county of Wilts.—The urban districts of Bradford-on-Avon, Melksham, Westbury, and Trowbridge, and the rural districts of Melksham, Bradford-on-Avon, and Wesbury.

To empower the Company within such limits to purchase, erect, maintain, manufacture, work, use, produce, store, supply, sell, let and dispose of lands or interests or easements in or over lands, stations, buildings, collieries, dynamos,
