Briftol, July 1.

Ere are lately arrived the Robert, the Great Dolphin, and one other flip from Barbados, with the Richard, and Richard and James, two large flaps from Virginia, but bring not any confiderable intelligence from either place.

Portfmuth, July 2. Yesterday came into Harbour the Monmouth, Mary, Princefs, and Nightingale, the last of them is now haling on shore, the rest expecting the opportunity of the next Spring-Tide. The Fairfax is gone out of the Dock, and will be fuddenly followed by the Adwice, the rest of the Sauadron continue at Spittheal.

vice, the reft of the Squadron continue at Spitthez1. , Rome, June 23. The Pope bath lately giv.n publick Audience to all the Forreign Minifters and Ambassai Jacours in this Couyt. This last Night the French Ambassai Jacour dispatcht away an Express to the King his Massai Jacour disgotiations having been of late managed with much privacy, and nor without jealouffe to the Spaniard, as fearing least this Courtmay be over-byassed in the Concernments of that Crown.

Don Nicho'as Antonio the Spanish Agent, hath with much earneftness folicited for the renewing a Licence formerly given by Pope Alexander the Seventh to His Catholick Majefty Philip the Fourth of Spain; impowering him for the space of rz years to tax his Clergy in equal proportion with the Laity, in confideration of his great Ex-, pences in his Wars with France; which the Pope has referred to the confideration of leveral Piclates delegated for that Affair, who have made fome foruples of such future Concession, by reason the Wars are now st an end; but the business is still under debate.

The French Fleet which hash continued for de w' i'e upon the Coaftsof Italy, hash kept the feveral Princes in fulpence of their deligns, which occafioned the Pope to enquire into their intentions, but had onely a general return made him by their Ambalfadour, that in little time His Holine's should have fuch an account of them, as would not at all difpleafe him.

The 20th inftant was observed the Annive. fary for the Creation of the Pope, who then entrad into the Second Year of his Papacy; but the Pope, though in health; was not prefent at the Solemnity, to receive the Complements of 4d multos annos, which are cultoms ily given upon the like Occasions.

The French Ambalfsdour is making preparation for Fireworks against Sunday next in the Evening, the day appointed by him to be frent with demonstrations of joy for the conclusion of the late Peace with Spain-

The Pope is making another, alteration in his Cuards, having changed his Lancie Spequee, and effablisht a Guard of K ights of Malthain their room.

From Ataples we are told of the attitul there of four Gallies of the Sicilian Squadron intended for spith, with the Duke di Ferrinding their General 5 who immediately, up m his landing gave a Vifit to the Viceroy : with him arrived allo the Archbishop de Monte Reale, in his paflage into Spain, in order to his Enflatement into the Archbishoprick of Valtaza.

Vienna, June 24. Since the death of the Cardinal de Thun Hi, Inperial Majelty has not as yet nominated any perfon for his Plenipotentiary to addit at the Diet of Ratisbowne in his room. They difcourfe of 3 perfons which ftand fair for this Employment, with the Prince d' sivenfberg, the Count de Swaertzenberg, and the Count de Wrifenwolfe, the Generality conceiving the Election may fall upon the latter.

Upon Complaints made to the Emperour by the Baffa of Buda, of the Robberics committed by the Huffars of Raibs, they have been condenned to make fatisfaction to the Chiaus emploied upon that account, and to pay to him a confiderable fum of moneys; fince which another party of Huffars and Hayduques have made an II curfion into another part of the Turkifh quarters, and taken away great numbers of Cattle: whereupon another Chiaus is within thele two dayes arrived from Buda with fresh Complaints, and an Aga expected to follow luim with demands of fatisfaction, and that punifhment may be inflicted upon the Offendors.

His Imperial Majefly continues his Court in this City ; having put off his intended journey to Marienzeel, the better to attend the present Affairs of the Empire, and 'tis believed will not depart hence for Ebersdorf till the end of Angust.

Twelve Enfignes with the Armes of Spain have been lent away fome time fince from hence, with a proportionable number of Muskets and Pikes, for Count Staremberg's Regiment, and himfelf fince gone post to joyn with them, being ordered to embark themfelves at Trieffe, upon fome Veffe's which there attend for their tran portation for Nap'as.

From H.ngary we are told, that Miebael Abaffi much encouraged by his dependancy on the Ottoman Court, flands high in his demands of Two hundred thou and Rixdollers, which he pretends to be due to him from the Prince Ragotzki3 to whom he has declared that if ful fatisfaction he nor forthwith made him accordingly, he is refolved by force of-Arms to reduce him to reafon.

The States of Hungary are eatneftly prefit ig for the reflitution of their Churches and Schools which have been taken from them, and feem unwilling to treat with the Commiffioners fent by His Imperial Majefty to confult with them at their Affembly upon that Subjed, patticularly objecting againft the Bifhop of Gran and Count Natafti, as perform whom they fulped to be ittle inclined to favour them in the B redrefs of their Grievences.

Paris, July 7. A Courrier Extraordinary arriving heres in 9 dayes from Poland, affures us of the Refolution of that King to refign his Crown, without any intentions of intereffing himfelf in the E ection of a Succeifer, and that 'tis believed he intends to patie the reft of his dayes in France.

Monfierr de Grimónville has by his Letters to the Court fignified that he had mode his Addreffes to His Imperial Maj:fly in the Name of the Moft. Chriftian King h's Mafter, defiring him to favour and countenance the Election of the Duke of Newbourg to the Crown of Poland, of which he had no An wer, but by the M nifters of that Court was told that the Emperour could not be induced to be over-zeal us for that Dake, who had flewn fome partiality in prejudice to the Houfe of Auftria; but if His Moft Chriftian Majefly wou d think favourably of Charles Prince of Lorraine, the Emperour would willingly concur with him for the promotion of his Intereft.

From Rome we are advertised that the Duke de Chaulnes Ambaffadour in that Court, has obtained from the Pope fome new Pris iledges and Indulgencies for His Majerie, late Conquefts in favour of the Bithop of Tournay and faveral Abheys & to which he was the rather induced upon the Accoung of free libercy His Maj-fly was pleafed to give him to pull down down the Pillar of Ignominy in memory of the injury offered by the Corfesto his late Ambailadour.

We are daily informed of New Levies made in divers places by the Spaniards, and that the Marquifs de Castel Rodrigo has lately entertained in the Spanish Service leveral Frei ch Soldiers both of Horle and Foot, which were difbanded by our Officers.

Another Courrier is also dispatched hither from Monsieur an Passage, with intelligence that the Spaniards were lately marched into Rouffillon with a Body of 5000 Horse and 7000 Foot, and had committed several disorders in the Country, and that they were encamped at a Town called Villars, which they were fortifying, with two other Polls up n the Frontiers of Catalonia.

H's Majefty infifts much upon the furrender of all places whethere found to be dependencies upon the places given up by the late Treaty, amongft which are accounted Condé as belonging to Aeth, and Nieuport, Farnes, and Charle mont to Binche, which proving to be a matter of forme difficulty, continues ftill in debate; but for the better compofure of this and all other matters in debate between both Growns, Monfieur Van Beuninghen, Ambaffadour from the States of the United Provinces, has diffatched a Courrier to Madrid, and 'tis believed the Baron de Bergeick may in few dayes be expected there.

From Franche Comte we are informed of the arrival there of the Marquils de Soueve, lent that from the Marquils de Caffet Rodrigo, to affure them of the care he takes for the re-fet lement of the Affairs of that Countrey, and withal to remove fome of the Magifti ates which were fulpetied to have been fauley in the late change; but arriving at Befançon, he found there the butinels already done to his hand, the Citizens having made a Reformation within themfelves, continuing onely 4 out of 28 of their Ancients, and as many out of the 14 Governours or Chief Magiftrates of that City, of which Proceedings they have given an Account by an Express fint to the Marquils de Cafiel Rodrigo, defiring his Concurrence and Affikance for the reftoring of that County to its former Effate and Condition.

At Dole fome time and pains have been fpent upon the reparation of their late ruined Fortifications, but the's Endeavours are much interrupted, they wanting both Men and Moneys for the carrying on of fogreat a Work; however they keep up the form of a Gerrifon, having about 50 Sentinells employed in the principal Streets, the Mayor with about 50 Horfe making the Night Watch 3 but their Guards onely confift of the Townefmen, who begin already to grow weary of the Duty.

The ist inflant the Bishop of Conton died fuddenly at *Autevil* near this City. The 5th the Prince of Monaco took his Oath as Duke of Vatentinois and Peer of France, and took his Seat accordingly in the Great Chamber with the Usual Ceremonies.

Some Endeavours are now used to compose the bulinest concerning the four differring Bishops, and to induce them to fign a Form fome time fince proposed to them; promising them to proceed onely by Verbal Process, which shall be entred in their Register, with a latitude to make their own Exposition of their Opinions, with what Referves they please, as hath been formerly practised in the Cale of forther Bishops.

Legorae fune zr. The F ench Fleet both of Men of Warr and Gallies departing from this Port, fleered their Courle to the Eaftwards, but for what place, or on what defigne is not yet differenced. The Batchetors Fish attiving here from Ireland, swas met by forms of the Turks Men of War, from whom the received civil ulage; off Alicent the faw to fail of English Marchant thips homewards bound, whereof one call ed the Walcome.

Bruges, Fuly 11. The plague is much increased of late in all parts of this Countrey, particularly at Brussells and Boway, and rages extreamly at Oudenard and Courtray. Several Vil ages near this place are also infected towards Blankenburg, which obliges the Magistrates of this place to beep fight Gunsds, not permitting any perfons to enter into this Town from any suspected places. The fud en death of some persons in the Streets, gave us 6 met apprehensions least the Infection were also gotten within this Town, but we hear not yet of any Contagion.

Lendon , July 3. His Majesty having to Ordered his Affairs, that his Two Houses of Parliament may forbear their affembling on the Eleventh day of August next, being the time prefixed, whereof he declared he would give timely notice, that they might fpare their attendance, at a feafon of the year when their being in the Countrey is fo necessary for their private occasions; and for other weighty Considerations, was this day pleafed (by the Advice of his Privy Council) to order his Proclamation to be illued out, publishing, notifying, and declaring his Will and Pleasure to be, That His House of Peers shall adjourne themselves, and also His Houfe of Commons shall adjourne themselves on the faid Eleventh day of August until the Tenth day of November next enfining ; whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and all others whom it may concern, may thereby take notice, and difpule His Majesty letting themfelves accordingly. them know that he will not at the faid Eleventh day of Angust expect the artendance of any, but onely fuch of either of the faid Houfes of Parliament, as being in or about the Cities of London and mestminster, may be present at the making the faid Adjournment.

Whitehall, July 4. The first instant the Right Honourable Francis Lord Newfort, having before received his White Staffe as Comptroller, of His Majesties Houshold, was sworn of the Privy Council, and took his place accordingly.

The 2d inflant their Majeflies, accompanied by his Royal Highnels, and his Highnels Prince, *Rupert*, and attended by feveral of the Nobility and Principal Perfons of the Court, did the Lord Chamberlain the Earl of *Mancheffer* the Honour to dine with him at his Houfeat *Walty* ham; where his Lordfhip treated them with much Magnificence.

The 3d inftant His Majefty, Royal Highness, and Prince Rupert, went in the Evening to Hampton-Court, from whence they returned again this Afternoon.
