. Rome, June 23. The Pope bath lately given publick Audience to all the Fo reign Ministers and Ambassa Jours in this Court. This last Night the French Ambatladour dispatcht away an Express to the King his Master; his Negotiations having been of late managed with much privacy, and nor without jealousie to the Spaniard, as fearing least this Court may be over-by affed in the Concernments of that

Don Nicho'as Antonio the Spanish Agent, hath with much earnestness solicited for the renewing a Licence fortherly given by Pope Alexander the Seventh to His Catholick Majesty Philip the Fourth of Spain, impowering him for the space of 12 years to tax his Clergy in equal proportion with the Laity, in confideration of his great Ex-Pences in his Wars with France; which the Pope has re-ferred to the confideration of several Prelates delegated for that Affair, who have made some scruples of such suture Concession, by reason the Wars are now at an end; but the bufmels is still under debate.

The French Fleet which hath continued force w' i'e upon the Coasts of Italy, hath kept the several Princes in Sulpence of their deligns, which occasioned the Pope to enquire into their intentions, but had onely a general return made him by their Amballadour, that in little time His Holiness should have such an account of them, as would not at all displease him.

The 20th instant was observed the Anniversary for the Greation of the Pope, who then entred into the Second Year of his Papacy; but the Pope, though in health; was not present at the Solemnity, to receive the Complements of Ad multos annos, which are cultoms ily given upon the like Occasions.

The French Ambassadour is making preparation for Fireworks against Sunday next in the Evening, the day appointed by him to be frent with demonstrations of Joy for the conclusion of the late Peace with Spain-

Upon Complaints made to the Emperour by the Bassa of Buda, of the Robberies committed by the Hussars of Rash, they have been condemned to make facisfaction to the Chiaus emploied upon that account, and to pay to him a confiderable fum of moneys; fince which another party of Hullars and Hayduques have made an I curlion into another part of the Turkish quarters, and taken away great numbers of Cattle: whereupon another Chiaus is within these two dayes arrived from Buda with fresh Complaints, and an Aga expected to follow him with demands of fatisfaction, and that punishment may be inslicted upon the Offendors.

The States of Hungary are eatnestly pressing for the reflitution of their Churches and Schools which have been taken from them, and seem unwilling to treat with the Commissioners sent by His Imperial Majesty to consult with them at their Assembly upon that Subject , patticularly objecting against the Bishop of Gran and Count Nadasti, as pers whom they suspect to be ittle inclined to savour them in the redress of their Grievances.
