COLONIAL STOCK ACT, 1900.

(63 and 64 Vict. c. 62.)

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, pursuant to section 2 of the "Colonial Stock Act, 1900," that the provisions of the Act have been complied with in respect of the undermentioned Stocks registered or inscribed in the United Kingdom:—

British Guiana.

4 per cent. Inscribed Stock (1935).

3 per cent. Inscribed Stock (1923-45).

British Honduras.

The necessary steps to comply with the conditions laid down by the Treasury under the Act have been taken by the Government of this Colony.

The restrictions mentioned in section 2, subsection (2), of the "Trustee Act, 1893," apply to Colonial Stocks (see "Colonial Stock Act, 1900," section 2).

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 29th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £1,500,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 4th January, 1903.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 3rd January, 1903, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 3rd July, 1903.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 30th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 3rd proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
