

and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the NOTTINGHAMSHIRE (SWINE - FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1903.
