## THE GREENWICH HOSPITAL ACT, 1865.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the draft of an Order in Council approving a Memorial of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, recommending that pensions to widows and allowances to children of seamen, &c., may be granted in the case of men who have died within two years (instead of twelve months) after being first certified to be ill.
