LICENSING ACTS, 1828-1902.

By virtue of section 48 of the Licensing Act, 1872, I hereby prescribe the following addition to the descriptions of Licences appended to the Forms of Licence prescribed in 1872, in order to carry into effect the provisions of section 10 of the Licensing Act, 1902:—

LICENSED WINE DEALER'S LICENCE (OFF). An Excise Licence under which wine may be sold by retail for consumption off the premises, in pursuance of 6 Geo. IV, cap. 81, sec. 2, and Acts amending the same.
