WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Devon) Order, 1903.

Dated 18th February, 1903.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Devon, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Devon) Order, 1903."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the following Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the County of Devon, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year:—

Bittern, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Plover-spige, Purre or Sealark), Gannet or Solan Goose, Grebe, Hobby, Lapwing or Peewit, Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat-sucker or Night Hawk), Nutteracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Plover, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot),
