ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 18TH FEBRUARY 1903.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animal Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order of the Board of Agriculture dated the 10th February, 1903, and relating to the steamship "Consuelo" and the animals carried in such vessel, is hereby modified in manner hereinafter provided.

2. The carcases of the animals on board the said vessel may be landed in Great Britain on or after the twenty-fifth day of February, 1903.

3. If the animals or any of them are transhipped to any other vessel the provisions of the above-mentioned Order shall apply to such vessel.

4. The steamship "Consuelo" and any vessel into which animals therefrom are transhipped shall, as soon as all animals and their carcases have been removed from the vessel, and before any animal or cargo is placed therein, be cleansed and disinfected in manner prescribed by Article 5 of the above-mentioned Order.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19TH FEBRUARY 1903.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. The Order of the Board of Agriculture dated the tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three, and relating to the steamship "Ohio" and the animals carried in

such vessel, is hereby modified in manner hereinafter provided.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Foreign Animals (Amendment) Order of 1902 (No. 2), the animals on board the said vessel may be landed at the Deptford Foreign Animals Wharf on or after the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three, in accordance with the provisions of the Foreign Animals Order of 1896: provided that the animals are previously transhipped into vessels provided by the Local Authority of the said Wharf.

3. The steamship "Ohio" shall, after all animals have been removed therefrom and while the vessel is not in any port of Great Britain, be forthwith cleansed and disinfected in manner prescribed by Article 5 of the said Order relating to the said vessel, and such cleansing and disinfection shall be deemed a compliance with the said Article.

4. Articles 6 and 7 of such last-mentioned Order are hereby revoked.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 23rd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £3,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 1st March, 1903.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 28th February, 1903, and will be payable at twelve months after date, viz.:—on the 28th February, 1904.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 24th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 28th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
