We beg respectfully to remind Your Majesties, that Woolwich is the birthplace of the King's Royal Navy; that it fitted out Sir Francis Drake's ships, and prepared Sir Walter Raleigh's expeditions, besides many other conquering and colonising enterprises, which helped to found Your Majesty's vast Empire; that it is also an important Garrison, and can claim to have been, Important Garrison, and can claim to have been, from the establishment of the regiment until very recently, the home of Your Majesty's Royal Artillery, and has yet in its midst the chief school of military science—the Royal Military Academy—where His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught received his first military training.
