The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Law of the Danish Government concerning measures against the introduction of contagious diseases into Iceland:—

We Christian the Ninth, by the Grace of God King of Denmark, the Wends and Goths, Duke of Sleswick, Holstein, Stormarn, Dithmarschen, Lauenburg and Oldenburg.

Give notice: that the ,, alping "have passed and We have sanctioned the following Law:

1st Part.

Explanations of words and general rules. Sec. 1.

In this present Act the following words are used in the significations as under.

"Foreign Countries" signifies any country outside of Iceland.

"Vessel" comprises any floating conveyance.

"Foreign Vessel" means any vessel arriving at this country, whether she has started on her last voyage from some foreign country, or has taken on board persons or goods at sea from any other vessel coming direct from some foreign country, or from any foreign fishing vessel. She shall continually be considered a foreign vessel, until she has obtained a certificate of health in

any Icelandic port.

"Bill of Health" signifies a certificate issued by the authorities of health concerned, purporting whether any foreign disease or other particularly named contagious disease be prevailing in the very port of sailing or in its vicinity.

"Foreign Diseases" comprises the plague, Asiatic cholera, smallpox, dysentery, exanthematic typhus, yellow fever, measles, and scarlet fever. "Certificate of Health" means a certificate

obtained by any foreign vessel from the Health Officer at the port of arrival in Iceland, purporting that nothing in the contents of this present Act prohibits the putting on shore at Icelandic ports of either persons or goods.

"Health Officer" is the official of any Icelandic

"Health Officer" is the official of any Icelandic port who, in pursuance of this present Act, has to inspect the bills of health of foreign vessels and to confer upon them certificates of health.

"Port" means an authorized trading place attended by a Health Officer (see sec. 5).

attended by a Health Officer (see sec. 5).
"Goods" comprises any movable objects in the vessel, including the catch.

"Prohibited Goods" mean goods, whose importation is prohibited by official notification of the Minister for Iceland or the Governor (,, land-shöfoingi") on account of danger of infection, or else made dependent on certain conditions (sec.

Sec. 2.

Any vessel arriving at this country from foreign countries, and intending to have connections with the shore or the inhabitants, shall be bound to carry a bill of health from the port of sailing, which, for vessels coming from foreign parts, shall be certified by the Danish Consul of the

place, or, if such be not found in the place, by the magistrate of said place.

Sec. 3.

Apart from cases of need or accident no foreign vessel or foreign fishing vessel shall be allowed to land persons or goods in other places than the ports, cfr. sec. 7.

Sec. 4.

Outside of the ports, either within or outside the maritime jurisdiction, no Icelandic vessel shall be allowed to take in goods from foreign vessels, except in case of need or accident.

Apart from cases of need or accident nobody shall be allowed to take into their homes or to come into personal contact with persons from foreign fishing vessels going ashore outside the ports.

2nd Part.

Quarantine Boards and Lazarettoes. Sec. 5.

In every market town and every authorized trading place of this country where a permanent mercantile establishment is found, there shall be a Quarantine Board.

In the market towns this Board shall be composed of the Town Judge ("bæjarfógeti") the District Physician, and one Town Councillor elected by the Town Council. The Town Judge shall be Chairman of the Board and Health Officer.

In all other places the Board shall be composed of the District Judge ("syslumaour"), if he be a resident of the place, the District Physician and one Resident of the place elected by the District Council ("syslumefnd"). If the District Judge be not residing in the trading place, he shall be replaced by his Resident Agent. The District Judge or his Agent shall be Chairman of the Board and Health Officer.

The Quarantine Boards shall see the rules and regulations of this present Act carried into effect.
Pilots, Bailiffs (", hreppstjóri"), Town Councils

Pilots, Bailiffs (,, hreppstjóri "), Town Councils and Parish Councils shall be bound to aid the Quarantine Boards in attending to their duties.

The Governor in concert with the Head Physician ("landlæknir") shall draw up regulations for the Quarantine Boards.

Sec. 6.

In each of the market towns of the country there shall be a Lazaretto fully fitted out to receive at any time from foreign vessels such sick persons as it may be necessary to isolate. These Lazarettoes shall be under control of the quarantine board concerned, who have to take care of the maintenance of the same and of their fit-out, as well as to see, that the needful attendance be at hand when required.

The district physician concerned shall attend the patients brought into the Lazaretto, unless the Governor by advice of the Head Physician designates another physician for the purpose.

The Governor in concert with the Head Physician shall form regulations for the use of the Lazarettoes.

3rd Part.

General rules concerning foreign vessels. Sec. 7.

If a foreign vessel wish to land persons or goods in some port, cfr. sec. 3, without being in the situation of being obliged to hoist the quarantine flag (sec. 11), the Master of the same shall go ashore alone and repair direct to the Health Officer, producing the bill of health of the vessel, in case it carries one, and give an account of the state of health on board. Until the Master has obtained a certificate of health from the Health Officer no other person shall be allowed on shore from the vessel, not even

the Pilot, nor shall anybody go on board her from shore or from other vessels, nor any goods be landed.

Sec. 8.

If the bill of health of the vessel be in order and do not contain any notice of contagious diseases prevailing in the place of sailing, the Health Officer shall at once confer a certificate of health on the vessel, provided the Master declares before him, that no persons are found on board the vessel suffering or having during the voyage suffered from such diseases as may be suspected to be contagious.

If the vessel carries no certificate of health, or only an unlawful one (cir. sec. 2), the Health Officer shall nevertheless as a rule confer a certificate of health on her without delay, provided the Master deliver to him a written bona fide asseveration, that no sick persons whose diseases may be suspected of being contagious, nor the bodies of persons dead of such diseases, are or have been on board the vessel, either in the

port of sailing or during the voyage.

If the bill of health of the vessel conveys that a contagious disease has been prevailing in the place of sailing, as well as if there be or have been sick persons on board the vessel during the voyage, or dead bodies, and there be reason to suppose that the disease in question may be or have been of a contagious nature, or there be reason to suppose that the above-said asseveration on the part of the Master be not fully satisfactory, no certificate of health shall be conferred, until the District Physician has examined the vessel and decided on the measures to be taken in order to prevent the introduction and spreading of contagious diseases. The issue of the certificate of health may be postponed, if needful, until the measures ordered by the physician be executed. If no Lazaretto be found in the place, and the physician find, that it will meet with difficulties to isolate the sick from the vessel, the latter together with the sick may be ordered to the next market town, if such removal be not combined with danger to the patients.

If the vessel be stranded, the manager of the salvage shall take care that the rules and regulations contained in this section and in sec. 7 be carried into effect as far as circumstances permit.

Certificates of health are issued free of charge.

Sec. 9.

The Governor in concert with the Head Physician may make such allowances from the rules and regulations contained in secs. 7 and 8, to men-of-war having surgeons on board, and to steamers plying regularly and by official time-tables between Iceland and other countries, as may be found appropriate and advisable.

4th Part.

Vessels obliged to carry a Quarantine Flag. Sec. 10.

If trustworthy intelligence has come to hand, of any foreign disease—not, however, the measles or the scarlet-fever—having appeared somewhere in foreign countries, the Minister for Iceland shall issue an official notification to the purport, that the foreign place in question and—provided the needful measures against the spreading of the disease from said place are not deemed to be taken—the neighbouring places to such extent as circumstances may require, are to be considered infected by the disease in question.

The above measure, however, shall not be taken, if only one or very few persons be suffering from the disease, and if there be no reason

to suppose that it will spread.

The Minister for Iceland shall give notice

when the measures taken are to be discontinued. The Governor shall be entitled to issue the notifications mentioned in this section, if he has received trustworthy information of the appearance or cessation of a disease before the eventual notification of the Minister has reached him. In this case he shall without delay report to the Minister what has been done.

Sec. 11.

If a vessel

1. Is coming from, or has during her voyage been in connection with, some place, as to which a notification has been issued pursuant to sec. 10, or where some foreign disease is reported by her bill of health to be epidemic;

2. Has during her voyage been in connection with a vessel which has or has had sick or dead persons on board, who are known or may reasonably be supposed to suffer or to have suffered from some foreign disease;

3. Has or has had, either in the port of sailing, or during her voyage, sick or dead persons on board, who may reasonably be supposed to suffer or to have suffered from some foreign disease;

Such vessel, entering the maritime jurisdiction of Iceland, or intending to touch at any Icelandic port, shall immediately on getting sight of land carry a yellow quarantine flag on her fore-top, or, if a yellow flag be not found on board, a white one, and this flag shall be kept flying until the vessel has got outside the maritime jurisdiction, or has entered some Icelandic port and there obtained a certificate of health.

Sec. 12.

If the case of the vessel be as mentioned in sec. 11 (1 and 2), she is allowed to euter any port.

If, however, her case be as mentioned in sec. 11, (3), she shall not be allowed to touch at any other port than one of the market towns of the country, cases of need or accident excepted.

Sec. 13.

Until permission be given to touch the shore, after the medical examination has taken place, the vessel shall be kept isolated, and none of those on board her shall be allowed to be put on shore, nor anybody from the shore or from other vessels to go on board the same, unless it be in virtue of office or official duty. Such persons as have been on board the said vessel shall be subject to the conditions for disinfection prescribed by the Quarantine Board or the physician, and they may, if necessary, be subject to the same treatment as those arrived by the vessel.

The medical examination of the vessel and the persons on board her shall be undertaken as soon as it is feasible; if no physician be at hand, the Health Officer shall the soonest possible call the District Physician; the Master of the vessel shall, however, be permitted to seek another port attended by a resident physician.

Sec. 14.

If the physician does not find anybody on board suffering from or dead of some foreign disease, and the master gives a written assevera-tion that nobody on board has been suffering from or has died of such disease, either in the port of sailing or during the voyage, and the vessel has no prohibited goods on board, a certificate of health shall be conferred on her, provided that from 5 to 14 days-according to the disease in question—have elapsed since the time that the vessel was last in connection with any infected place or vessel.

In case that the above said term be not | elapsed, the Quarantine Board shall-if necessary-put the vessel under quarantine until the deficient time has expired. After that time a certificate of health shall be conferred on the vessel, provided that none of those on board her have been seized by any foreign disease during the quarantine. If the vessel be a man-of-war, the examination by the District Physician may be omitted, if the surgeon gives him information of the state of health on board. The quarantine measures to be taken against the vessel, based upon these informations, pursuant to this or the following sections, shall be intimated to the Commander of the vessel.

Sec. 15.

If it be proved that the vessel, either in the port of sailing or during her voyage, has had any sick or dead on board, who may reasonably be supposed to suffer or to have suffered from some foreign disease, or else that the vessel be carrying prohibited goods, no intercourse with the land shall be allowed until she has been disinfected to such extent as the Quarantine Board or the physician may decide, and the prohibited goods, which it has not been feasible to disinfect on board, have been destroyed. After this the authorities shall proceed pursuant to the foregoing section.

Sec. 16.

If, on examination by the physician, the vessel be found to have sick or dead persons on board, who may be reasonably supposed to be or to have been affected by some foreign disease, the Quarantine Board, keeping the vessel perfectly isolated, has to take care (1) that the sick be carried to some Lazaretto, so that, if no such place be found in the port, she shall be directed to some market-town, (2) that the dead bodies be taken out of the vessel and interred, (3) that the vessel be disinfected to the needful extent, (4) that any prohibited goods, which cannot be disinfected on board, be destroyed, and (5) that the non-affected part of the crew or passengers of the vessel be isolated either in the vessel or in some particular premises on shore, until the lapse of from 5 to 14 days after the disinfection or the disembarkation.

Sec. 17.

If the Master of the vessel declares that she is only calling for coal, provisions or any other supply or order necessary for the continuation of the voyage, he may claim to be exempt from a medical examination of the vessel, against which he and his vessel shall be subject to the particular inspection, which the Quarantine Board may deem necessary to institute in order to prevent the introduction of some foreign disease into the country from the said vessel.

Sec. 18.

As to vessels conveying emigrants, and vessels which by their uncleanly condition or otherwise offer particularly unfavourable conditions for healthiness, the Quarantine Board may decide, that measures be taken pursuant to sec. 16, although the conditions for such proceedings be not otherwise extant.

Sec. 19.

The Governor in concert with the Head Physician shall draw up rules and regulations for the disinfection of vessel and goods.

If requested by the Quarantine Board, the vessel shall be bound to furnish the affordable number of hands and other assistance in disinfecting her.

Sec. 20.

If a vessel which, pursuant to sec. 12, 2nd paragraph, was to touch at a market-town, be linterment of the dead and all other charges re-

forced by accident or case of need to seek another port, the Health Officer of that place shall without delay convoke the Quarantine Board, who have to treat the vessel according to the above sections, as far as may be possible.

If the vessel be in immediate need of assistance before the physician shall arrive, the Health Officer shall provide assistance, which shall possibly be afforded without any person from the vessel going ashore or anybody from land going on board.

The Quarantine Board shall as soon as possible direct the vessel to the nearest market-town and take care that the physician, if needed, attend the vessel.

Sec. 21.
In cases of stranded vessels and prohibited goods the nearest Quarantine Board or the Sheriff "Politimesteren") shall cause the needful to be done as far as possible in accordance with the rules and regulations of the above sections.

If any vessel or prohibited goods, supposed to issue from some port infected by the plague, drift ashore, they should remain untouched after having been secured with due precaution, until the Sheriff on examination has decided on the proceedings to be adopted. In case the objects must be supposed to be infectious, the salvors shall be subject to proper isolation pursuant to the principles of the above sections.

Sec. 22

The Minister for Iceland (the Governor) may, on issuing an official notification pursuant to sec. 10, at the same time prohibit or conditionalise the import from the suspected place of certain kinds of goods to be specified in the notification.

Sec. 23.

If the measles, the scarlet fever or the influenza should appear in any foreign place, widespread or of a malignant nature, the Minister (the Governor) may issue a public notification as established with respect to the foreign diseases in sec. 10, and if the case be the same with respect to any contagious disease not belonging to those designated as such in this Act, the rules and regulations established in this 4th Part may be brought into effect by Royal Mandate.

If the danger caused by a disease of the lastnamed kind should claim urgent measures, such may be taken by the Governor in concert with the Head Physician, so that a report shall immediately be sent to the Minister for Iceland

in order to acquire Royal sanction.

5th Part.

Regulations about defraying the cost, fines, abrogation of Laws, Royal letters, &c.

Sec. 24.

For examinations pursuant to this Act there shall be due to the physician a fee of Kr. 4 for vessels of below 60 tons, of Kr. 6 for vessels of from 60 to not above 100 tons, and of Kr. 10 for vessels of above 100 tons.

The physician, besides, is entitled to free conveyance and a daily allowance according to the Act of 13th October, 1899, on the re-adjustment of the medical districts in Iceland, &c., sec. 6, however, so that the daily allowances be eventually charged also for the time, during which he may himself be subject to quarantine in consequence of his duty.

Sec. 25.

The procuring, fitting-out and maintenance of the Lazarettoes mentioned in sec. 6, are defrayed by the Public Treasury; likewise the charges for attending the sick in the Lazarettoes, for the sulting from the carrying into effect of this Act, the following cases, however, excepted:

a. The vessel shall always pay the physician's fee pursuant to sec. 24, and the charges of con-

veying the physician on and off.

b. The vessel itself shall defray the charges resulting from the inspection mentioned in sec. 17 and in this case likewise the charges for attending the sick in the Lazarettoes and the interment of the dead; the same if the sick be brought to the Lazaretto on account of other diseases than the foreign.

c. If the vessel be a foreign fishing vessel, she shall defray all charges otherwise devolving on the Public Treasury. The same shall be applicable to all other foreign vessels, if they were not bound for any Icelandic port, and the Quarantine Board judge that they have only come in on account of disease or to pass quarantine.

d. The cost incurred pursuant to this Act in case of stranding shall be defrayed by the estate of the stranded vessel and goods, as far as it

goes.

e. The charges resulting from persons having contrary to law gone on board vessels subject to quarantine, shall be defrayed by the guilty parties, so far as they may be recovered from them. The recovery shall, if necessary, take place by distraining.

Sec. 26.

The Public Treasury shall not be responsible for damages and losses caused to vessels or goods in consequence of the measures taken pursuant to this present Act.

Sec. 27.

Infringements of the rules and regulations contained in this Act or of the orders or injunctions consequent on the same shall be subject to fines of from 20 to 500 Kr.—if no higher penalty be incurred according to common laws,—and if the rules and regulations of the above Part 4 be in force, to the penalty of imprisonment (Common Penalties Act, sec. 26) or under particularly extenuating circumstances to fines of from 50 to 1000 Kr. The fines shall devolve on the Public Treasury.

If the penalty may be judged not to surpass a fine, the Quarantine Board shall be entitled to accept the offer of the guilty party of paying down a fine to the Public Treasury in order to

avoid prosecution.

The goods whose importation is attempted or effected, against the prohibitions issued in consequence of this Act, shall—if they are not to be destroyed—be seized for the benefit of the Public Treasury.

Sec. 28.

Any vessel cleared out in this country shall be entitled to a Certificate from the Health Officer, purporting whether any foreign disease or other particularly named contagious disease is prevailing in the port of sailing or its vicinity. Such Certificate shall be given gratuitously.

Any party, whose term of quarantine has expired, may claim a Certificate of having passed the quarantine; and the master may claim the same on behalf of the vessel as soon as her term of quarantine has legally expired.

Sec. 29.

The Edict of 8th February, 1805, concerning the quarantine system in Denmark and Norway, and the Royal Mandate of 20th June, 1838, concerning the abrogation of Mandates of 18th May, 1787, and 27th May, 1803, for Iceland and the Färöe Islands, shall be abrogated. Further shall be abrogated the Order in Council of 6th June, 1851, concerning measures towards regulating

the quarantine system, the Act of 17th December, 1875, concerning measures towards preventing the introduction of small-pox, Asiatic cholera, and other contagious diseases into Iceland, the Act of 24th October, 1879, containing amendments of the latter, and the Act of 18th December, 1897, containing amendments of the above-named Quarantine Act of 17th December, 1875.

Sec. 30.

This present Act shall be printed in Icelandic, Danish, German, English, and French, to such extent that a sufficient number of copies may be transmitted to the Danish Consuls in foreign countries, and one copy be delivered to each vessel subject to quarantine.

Sec. 31.

The above Act shall come into force from and with the first day of July, 1903.

Note.—As to the rules and regulations contained in secs. 6, 8, 3d paragraph, 12, 2nd paragraph, 16 and 20, the public attention is called on the fact that in the first time after the coming in force of this Act there will only be found Lazarettoes in the market towns of Reykjavik and Seydisfjord. As soon as such will be erected at Isafjord and Akureyri, it will be advertised in the Gazette.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(Dated 23rd March 1903.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. The provisions of this Order shall apply to the vessel named in the Schedule hereto and to all animals now carried in such vessel.
- 2. Any Inspector of the Board of Agriculture shall be permitted to examine the animals at such time or times as he may require while the vessel is in any port of Great Britain.
- 3. No person, except as hereinafter provided, shall, while the animals are in any port of Great Britain, enter a pen in which the animals are, or have recently been kept; Provided that Inspectors of the Board of Agriculture and all persons while actually engaged in tending the animals or cleansing or disinfecting the pens shall be exempted from the prohibition contained in this Article.
- 4. Every person upon leaving a pen in which the animals are or have recently been kept shall thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots with a five per cent. solution of carbolic acid, and every such person shall before landing from the vessel in Great Britain change or effectually disinfect his clothes.
- 5. The animals may be landed at the Deptford Foreign Animals Wharf on or after the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three, provided that they are previously transhipped into vessels provided by the Local Authority of the said Wharf.
- 6. No carcase of an animal shall be landed from the vessel in any port of Great Britain except with the written authority of an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture.

- 7. The vessel shall, after all animals have been removed therefrom, and while the vessel is not in any port of Great Britain, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:—
 - (i.) All parts of the vessel with which any animal or its dung have come in contact shall be scraped and swept and then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and subsequently disinfected with a five per cent. sclution of carbolic acid or with chloride of lime or some other suitable disinfectant.
 - (ii.) All fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils used for or about the animals shall be scraped and then cleansed and disinfected in the same manner as the vessel.
 - (iii.) The scrapings and sweepings shall be forthwith thoroughly mixed with lime, and be discharged into the sea.
- 8. While the vessel remains in any port of Great Britain, all dung of the animals, and all litter removed from the pens, shall at intervals not exceeding twenty-four hours be thoroughly mixed with lime and then carried by water outside the port and there discharged into the sea.
- 9. If anything is done or emitted to be done with respect to the vessel or the animals therein, or the carcase of any such animal, in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- 10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Animals" means cattle, sheep and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine:
 - "Master" includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:
 - "Carcase" means the carcase of an animal, and part of a carcase, and the meat, bones, bide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof:
 - "Port" includes a sub-port, haven or creek, and the limits of a port for the purposes of this Order shall be the limits declared under the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876.

EAST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1903.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Restriction on Movement of Swine out of Scheduled District.

1. Swine shall not be moved out of the district described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District), except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement of Swine with Licence.

- 2.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place) may be moved out of the Scheduled District if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorizing such movement granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are when the Licence is granted.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue, and shall only be granted on a Declaration, to the effect hereinafter provided, signed by the owner of the swine or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose.
- (3.) Every person to whom application is made for a Licence shall, so far as is practicable, before granting the same, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the Declaration, and that the proposed movement is necessary or expedient.
- (4.) The Declaration shall be retained by the person granting the Licence and disposed of by him as may be directed by the Local Authority on whose behalf the Licence was granted.
- (5.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place and premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved.
- (6.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (7.) A Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them under this Order.

Declaration necessary for Licence for Movement of Swine.

- 3. The Declaration shall be to the effect-
- (i.) that the swine to be moved have been bred and exclusively fed on the premises from which they are to be moved or have been on such premises for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other pig has been brought on to those premises within such period;

(ii.) that the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever;

and
(iii.) that the movement of such swine is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Certain restrictions on Movement of Swine not to be affected.

4. Movement of swine under this Order is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine, and also to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than swine-fever.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

5. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, swine may be moved in any circumstances if accompanied by a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Granting of Movement Licences.

- 6.—(1.) A Local Authority may appoint fit and proper persons for the purpose of granting, subject to the provisions of this Article, Movement Licences for the purpose of this Order.
- (2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.



- (c) Denmark-hill, Champion Park, Grovelane, Dog Kennel-hill, Grove-vale, and Lordship-lane.
- (d) Queen's-road, Peckham.

Construction of a subway and tramway between Theobald's-road and Victoria Embankment under the London County Council (Subways and Tramways) Act, 1902.

Acquisition or contributions towards acquisition of lands for parks and open spaces under the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1902:—

- (1) Southfields, Fulham.
- (2) Ravenscourt Park.
- (3) Clapham Common.

Erection of bandstand, and laying out, &c., Horniman Gardens, under London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1901.

Providing sites for and building, enlarging, and improving lunatic asylums, buildings, fittings, furniture, equipment, heating, sinking wells, machinery, planting, road making, establishment of an epileptic colony at Horton, fencing, and miscellaneous expenditure on improvement and development of lands held with the various asylums.

General expenditure in connection with Industrial Schools.

Provision of reformatories for inebriates, erection and adaptation of buildings, furnishing, equipment, lighting, disposal of sewage, water supply, new roads, and incidental expenditure in connection therewith.
