

d'Arnell's, who are to serve as *Mareschals de Camp* under the *Mareschal de Bellifant*, went hence yesterday towards *Normandy*, to Post several Battalions along that Coast; The whole Body that is to be employed on that side, will consist of about 18000 Men. They write from *Toulon*, That the Count *d'Estree* had twice put to Sea with his Squadron of 16 Men of War, 6 Fireships, and 3 Gallies for Bombs, but that the contrary Winds had as often driven him back to the *Illes of Hieres*, where he still continued when these Letters came away; And from *Brest* we are told, That the *Marquis de Nesmond* was going out with several Men of War, to meet, as 'twas thought, the said Squadron from *Toulon*. The Resident of the Duke of *Hannover* is gone home. This Week was Published here an Edict, by which all the old Pieces of Money, both of Gold and Silver, that are not Reformed, or new Stamp'd, according to the Edict of *December 1639*, are cry'd down, However they will be received during the months of *May* and *June* next, at the Office of the Mint, in order to be new Stamp'd, the *Louis d'Or* at 11 Livres, 5 Sols, and the Crown Pieces at 60 Sols. And the New Stamp'd Pieces are reduced from 12 Livres 10 Sols (to which they were raised by the before mentioned Declaration of 1689) to 12 Livres, and the Crown Pieces from 66 to 64 Sols, and so other pieces proportionably.

Brussels, April 9. The Prince de *Vaudemont* goes hence this Evening to wait upon the King at *Loos*. The Baron de *Berinsau* is come hither to Compliment the Elector of *Bavaria* in the Name of the Elector of *Cologne* his Brother. 'Tis still said that his Electoral Highness will go very speedily to visit the Spanish Garisons in *Flanders*. Yesterday marched from hence the Regiment of the *Rhin-grave* towards *Namur*; whither another Regiment of Foot went at the same time from *Malmes*. We hear that the French have marked out a Camp near *Leuze*; and they talk likewise of having a flying Camp near *Philipville*, between the *Sambre* and the *Meuse*.

Hague, April 11. His Grace the Duke of *Ormond* arrived two days ago at *Willemsstadt*, with the first Troop of Guards, Commanded by the Earl of *Scarborough*, *Wyndham's* Regiment of Horse, and *Eppinger's* Dragoons. We have an account likewise of the arrival of Lieutenant General *Talmash* in the *Maef*. The *Sips* fitted out by the Admiralties of *Amsterdam* and *Rotterdam*, as their Quota for this Summers Expedition, are now ready to go to Sea; And those of *Zeland* will be ready in 10 days. The Elector and Electores *Palatin* are expected here the beginning of the next Week.

Falmouth, April 2. On Tuesday last Sailed from hence the five *East India* Ships; with several other outward bound Merchantmen. The *Eagle* of *London* came in here 2 days ago from *Jamaica*; and yesterday arrived in this Port the *Assistance* of *Falmouth* from the *Cadaries*; and the *Lemon Tree* from *Maryland*. This Week was cast away near the *Lizard*; a Ketch laden with Butter and Cheese at *Bristol*.

Plimouth, April 1. Yesterday came into this Port the *St. John* of, and bound to *Amsterdam*; She came with the last Convoy from *Cadix*, but losing a Top-Mast, could not keep Company with the rest of the Fleet, and has been ever since bearing at Sea; She is very richly laden. The *Dolphin* of *London*, bound for the *Barbadoes*, and the *John and James* bound for *Guiny*, who sailed hence last Tuesday with the *Nonsuch*, are forced back into this Port.

Portsmouth, April 5. On the 3d instant Their Majesties Ship the *St. Albans* came to Spithead from the Eastward; and yesterday the *Monk*. A new Ship of 80 Guns will be launched at *Douthampton* on Friday next.

Deal, April 5. The Transport Ships that have on board Colonel *Trelawney's* Regiment of Foot, are now in the *Downes* expecting a fair Wind to proceed for *Ostend*.
