

the 4th May, 1903, he made an Order under section 54, subsection 4, of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending the special exception under that section which allows the employment of male young persons above 16 at night to that part of any factory in which reverberatory or regenerative furnaces are used and necessarily kept in operation day and night. The Order, further, revokes the extension of the special exception to oil and seed crushing mills and iron ore washing granted by the Order of the 16th November, 1895, and consolidates that Order and the Order of the 22nd August, 1902.
