* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the local inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure that officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.

In the High Court of Justice.—Companies (Winding up).
Mr. Justice Byrne.
No. 00102 of 1903.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1893, and in the Matter of A. R. DEAN Limited.

BY an Order made by Mr. Justice Byrne in the above matters, dated the 19th day of May, 1903, on the petition of O. C. Hawkes Limited, whose registered office is situate at Globe Works, Bromsgrove-street, in the city of Birmingham, creditors of the above named Company, praying that an Order might be made for the continuance of the voluntary winding up of the said Company but subject to the supervision of the Court, it was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the said A. R.
