#### NORTH METROPOLITAN ELECTRIC POWER SUPPLY.

(Power to Willesden Urban District Council to Sell and to Company to Purchase Lands and Generating Station at Willesden, and to maintain and erect Works thereon; Power to Company to Supply Electricity and Exercise Powers within the District of the Council; Agreements; Application of Funds, and Additional Capital; Repeal and Amendment of Acts.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the North Metropolitan Electric Power Supply Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for an Act for the following purposes or some of them (that is to say):—

(1) To empower the Urban District Council of Willesden to sell and the Company to purchase and to hold the lands hereinafter mentioned or some part or parts thereof together with the generating station, buildings, machinery, plant, and works erected or being thereon (that is to say):—

Certain lands, containing one hundred and forty three thousand and sixteen square feet or thereabouts, belonging or reputed to belong to the Council, situate in or near Taylor's-lane, Harlesden, in the parish of Willesden, in the county of Middlesex, and bounded on the east side thereof by the Midland and South Western Junction Railway, and on the north side thereof by a new road intended to be called Gibbons-road, and on the west and south west sides thereof by land belonging or reputed to belong to Frederick Gibbons, and on the south east side thereof partly by Selwyn-road and partly by land forming the garden of No. 44, Selwyn-road;

and to empower the Company upon such lands or any part thereof, to continue to maintain, erect, work, extend, enlarge, and use a station or stations for generating, transforming and transmitting electrical energy with all dynamos,

batteries, transformers, accumulators, condensers, engines, apparatus, plant, machinery, and other works, appliances, and conveniences for that purpose and to generate, transform and transmit such energy accordingly.

(2) To make provision with reference to the purchase money, and for securing the same or part thereof, by mortgage of the said lands or otherwise.

(3) To empower the Company to exercise within the Urban District of Willesden, in the County of Middlesex, all or some of the powers, privileges, and authorities which they are by the said Act empowered to exercise within the limits defined in the section 5 of the Act of 1900, or any part thereof, for such purposes, and upon such terms and conditions, and with and subject to such restrictions and limitations as may be agreed upon between the Council of the said district and the Company, or as may be prescribed or provided for by the intended Act.

(4) To extend and make applicable to the Company, and to the objects of the intended Act and to the said district, all or some of the provisions of the Act of 1900, and of the Acts incorporated therewith, with such additions, variations, modifications or amendments, as may be necessary or expedient to give effect to the objects of the intended Act, and, if thought fit, to incorporate with the intended Act, or make applicable to the Company for the purposes of the intended Act, with or without variation or modification, other provisions of the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 and 1888, and the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, and any other Act or Acts incorporated with the Act of 1900 in addition to the provisions already incorporated or applicable.

(5) To authorize agreements between the said District Council and the Company with reference to the objects and purposes of the intended Act or matters connected therewith, and to confirm and give effect to any such agreements.

(6) To empower the Company to apply to the purposes of the intended Act any moneys which they are already authorized to raise and to raise further moneys for those purposes.

(7) To repeal, subject and in accordance with the provisions of the intended Act, sections 5, 6, and 8 of the North Metropolitan Electric Power Supply Act, 1902.

(8) To vary or extinguish all existing rights or privileges which may interfere with the attainment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

(9) To repeal, alter, or amend all or some of the provisions of the Act of 1900, and any other Act relating to the Company and the Willesden Local Board Act, 1876, and any other Act relating to the Council, including any Act of the present Session relating to the Council.

(10) Printed copies of the intended Act will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 11th day of the present month of June.
