

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Suspension in part of General Consolidated Order: District Medical Officers' Fees.

SHEFFIELD UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Sheffield Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, which is in force in the Sheffield Union, provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases;

And whereas by divers Orders We, the Local Government Board, suspended the operation, until We by Order should otherwise direct, of Articles 177, 182, and 183 of the above-cited Order with respect to the Medical Officers for the time being for certain of the Medical Relief Districts of the said Union, and of Article 182 of the said Order with respect to the Medical Officer for the time being of the Workhouse of the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the Articles of the first above-cited Order, that is to say, Articles 177 and 181, 182, and 183, by which provision was made as aforesaid, with respect to the District Medical Officers for the several Medical Relief Districts of the said Union:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby suspend the operation, until We by Order shall otherwise direct, of Articles 177 and 181, 182, and 183 of the first above-cited Order with respect to the District Medical Officers for the time being for the several Medical Relief Districts of the said Union.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,413,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 24th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 24th June, 1903, and will be payable at twelve months after date, viz.:—on the 24th June, 1904.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Saturday, the 20th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Wednesday, the 24th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
