The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the thirtieth day of July in the year one thousand nine hundred and three in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish (some-time particular district) of Christ Church Hougham in Dover within the original limits of the parish of Hougham in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Christ Church Hougham in Dover is a new parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Christ Church Hougham in Dover which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of

Hougham have become vested in us under the provision of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of one hundred and twenty pounds per annum to the minister of the said proposed separate district so soon as a minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors.

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of one thousand pounds sterling towards providing a further endowment for the said proposed separate district and so soon as such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act then of the said new parish and towards the maintenance of the minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being and we have in respect of such sum of one thousand pounds sterling agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year to such minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the lastly-mentioned Act the sum of thirty pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of one thousand pounds towards providing the endowment for the said proposed separate district has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the contributors of the said sum of one thousand pounds towards providing the endowment for the said proposed separate district have nominated Francis Augustus Bevan of No. 54 Lombard-street in the city of London Banker John Francis William Deacon of No. 20 Birchin-lane in the city of London Banker, Henry Martyn Mowll of Dover in the said county of Kent, Solicitor, the Reverend William Hugh Falloon of Christ Church Vicarage Dover, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the Very Reverend William Hagger Barlow Doctor in Divinity, Dean of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough, their heirs and assigns, as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish should be assigned.

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of one hundred and twenty pounds will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Christ Church Hougham in Dover which

is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Martin Dover.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Francis Augustus Bevan, John Francis William Deacon, Henry Martyn Mowll, William Hugh Falloon, and William Hagger Barlow their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Martin Dover being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Christ Church Hougham-in-Dover in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury which is bounded upon the north partly by the new parish of Saint Bartholomew Charlton-by-Dover and partly by the parish of Poulton upon the west by the parish of Hougham all in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-east and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said parish of Hougham the new parish of Trinity Dover in the said county and diocese and the said new parish of Christ Church Hougham-in-Dover all meet which point is upon the boundary of that portion of the property of the War Department which is known as 'The Citadel' and extending thence north-eastward along the boundary of the said property for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of Belgrave-road and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of Belgrave-road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the premises of the Belgrave Infants' School and extending thence south-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of two hundred and thirteen feet or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned premises and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of forty-six feet or thereabouts to the south-western end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the same premises and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of one hundred and ninety-seven feet or thereabouts to its north-eastern end upon the south-western side of Belgrave-road and extending thence first north-eastward to and then north-westward along the

middle of Belgrave-road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Folkestone-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Folkestone-road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the north-eastern side of the road called or known as Glen Grove and extending thence north-westward along the said north-eastern side of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its present north-western end and continuing thence north-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church Hougham-in-Dover from the said new parish of Saint Bartholomew Charlton-by-Dover."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbent of the new parish out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken. And whereas a period of one calendar month has elapsed since the said drafts were transmitted to the said patrons and Incumbent and such patrons and Incumbent have made no objections to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS by sections 3A, 4, and 5A of the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 10) Act 1895, Session 2 it is provided that if at any time thereafter it shall appear that the number of citizens on the citizens' roll in the two wards by the Order constituted in the Walton District shall be seven thousand five hundred and upwards it shall be the duty of the Council of the city (thereinafter referred to as "the Council") within three months from such citizens' roll coming into operation to petition the Queen to increase the number of wards in the Walton District from two to three and the number of the Councillors in the City Council by three and the number of Aldermen by one and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to increase the number of wards councillors and aldermen accordingly and all provisions of section thirty sub-sections two to fifteen inclusive of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 shall subject as aforesaid apply accordingly and that the provisions of section three shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to the added part of West Derby (meaning thereby the West Derby District comprising the Fairfield and West Derby Wards mentioned in the Warrant hereinafter recited). And that if at any time thereafter it shall appear

that the number of citizens on the citizens' roll in the ward by the Order constituted in the Wavertree District shall be four thousand five hundred and upwards it shall be the duty of the Council within three months from such citizens' roll coming into operation to petition the Queen to divide the Wavertree District into two wards and to increase the number of Councillors in the City Council by three and the number of Aldermen by one and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to increase the number of wards councillors and aldermen accordingly and all provisions of section thirty sub-sections two to fifteen inclusive of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, shall subject as aforesaid apply accordingly.

And whereas on the twenty-second day of January one thousand nine hundred and one Her Majesty Queen Victoria died and was succeeded by His Majesty King Edward.

And whereas on the twenty-third day of July one thousand nine hundred and three the Right Honourable Aretas Akers-Douglas His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department did appoint Archibald Bence Bence-Jones Barrister-at-Law to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme to determine the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the two wards of the Wavertree Ward of the city of Liverpool and the three wards of the West Derby District (comprising the Fairfield and West Derby Wards) the number of the Councillors of the city of Liverpool being increased by six and the number of Aldermen by two the number of wards and the increase of the Councillors and Aldermen having been fixed by the Order of His Majesty in Council made in that behalf on the twenty-eighth day of March one thousand nine hundred and three.

Now I the said Archibald Bence Bence-Jones do hereby in pursuance of the said warrant and appointment declare this to be my scheme for the purposes of the said Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 10) Act 1895 Session 2 incorporating the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 section thirty sub-sections two to fifteen inclusive and I hereby fix and determine that the boundaries of the wards of the said West Derby District (comprising the Fairfield and West Derby Wards) of the said city of Liverpool shall be as follows namely:—

#### The Fairfield Ward

shall include so much of the said West Derby District as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the boundary of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward where the northern boundary of the said hitherto existing ward is intersected by the line of the Bootle Branch of the London and North Western Railway Company near Binns-road proceeding thence along the southern western and northern boundaries of the hitherto existing Fairfield Ward to the point of intersection of Lower Breck-road and of Rocky-lane thence in an easterly direction along the centre of West Derby-road as far as the point at which West Derby-road intersects the said line of railway at Tue Brook Station proceeding thence in a southerly direction along the west side of the said line of railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### The West Derby Ward

shall include so much of the said West Derby District as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the northern boundary of the Fairfield Ward as hereinbefore defined at the point of intersection aforesaid of Lower

Breck-road and of Rocky-lane proceeding thence in north-westerly and north-easterly directions successively along the boundaries of the Fairfield and West Derby Wards as hitherto existing to the municipal boundary thence in a south-easterly direction along the municipal boundary to the junction of Leyfield-road and Honeys Green-lane thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Honeys Green-lane to Eaton-road thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Eaton-road to Alder-road thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Alder-road to Black Horse-lane thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Black Horse-lane to Moscow-drive thence in a westerly direction along the centres of Moscow-drive and Lister-drive to the point at which Lister-drive crosses the line of the Bootle Branch of the London and North Western Railway Company thence in northerly and westerly directions successively along the boundary of the Fairfield Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

#### The Old Swan Ward

shall include so much of the said West Derby District as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid in the boundary of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward where the northern boundary of the said hitherto existing ward is intersected by the line of the Bootle Branch of the London and North Western Railway Company near Binns-road proceeding thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the Fairfield Ward as hereinbefore defined to Lister Drive aforesaid thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of the West Derby Ward as hereinbefore defined to the municipal boundary proceeding thence in south-easterly and westerly directions along the municipal boundary to a point in the boundary of the Wavertree Ward as hitherto existing where the line of the Liverpool and Manchester Branch of the London and North Western Railway Company intersects the municipal boundary near Broad Green-road thence in a westerly direction along the boundary of the Wavertree Ward as hitherto existing to the point of commencement aforesaid.

And I also fix and determine that the boundaries of the wards of the said Wavertree Ward of the city of Liverpool shall be as follows namely:—

#### The Wavertree Ward

shall include so much of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid in the northern boundary of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward where the Bootle Branch of the London and North Western Railway Company intersects the said boundary near Binns-road proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the boundary of the Old Swan Ward as hereinbefore defined to the municipal boundary where the Liverpool and Manchester Branch of the London and North Western Railway Company intersects the municipal boundary near Broad Green-road proceeding thence in south-easterly and south-westerly directions successively along the municipal boundary to a point in the said boundary marked by a boundary stone opposite the terrace known as Sefton Park View proceeding thence in north-easterly and north-westerly directions successively along the boundary of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward to a point where the said boundary is intersected by the line of the London and North Western Railway Company near the junction of Garmoyle-road and Smith-down-road proceeding thence in a northerly

direction along the Parliamentary boundary of the city defined by the Redistribution of Seats Act 1885 Schedule 5 (Name of Parliamentary Borough Liverpool) to the point of commencement aforesaid.

The Wavertree West Ward shall include so much of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at the point aforesaid in the northern boundary of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward where the Bootle Branch of the London and North Western Railway Company intersects the said boundary near Binns-road proceeding thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the Wavertree Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction aforesaid of Garmoyle-road and Smithdown-road thence in north-westerly northerly and easterly directions successively along the boundary of the hitherto existing Wavertree Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

And I the said Commissioner in further pursuance of the terms of the said Warrant and for the purposes aforesaid do hereby assign and apportion all the hitherto existing Councillors of the said West Derby District (comprising the Fairfield and West Derby Wards) among the Fairfield Ward the West Derby Ward and the Old Swan Ward respectively as hereinbefore defined of the city of Liverpool as follows namely:

To the Fairfield Ward: Thomas May Smith, Joseph Hunter, Frank John Leslie.

To the West Derby Ward: (one Councillor to be hereafter elected) (one Councillor to be hereafter elected) (one Councillor to be hereafter elected.)

To the Old Swan Ward: William Ramsden, James Lister, Thomas Utley.

And I also hereby assign and apportion all the hitherto existing Councillors of the said Wavertree Ward among the Wavertree Ward and the Wavertree West Ward respectively as hereinbefore defined of the city of Liverpool as follows namely:—

To the Wavertree Ward: (one Councillor to be hereafter elected) (one Councillor to be hereafter elected) (one Councillor to be hereafter elected.)

To the Wavertree West Ward: Arthur Crosthwaite, Isaac Turner, James Wilcox Alsop.

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that Rules so framed shall be valid only if approved by the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken into consideration the said Rules, together with a representation of the General Medical Council with respect thereto, are pleased to approve the same as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed for the period of three years.

SCHEDULE referred to in the foregoing Order.

Central Midwives Board.

Rules framed under Section 3 I of the Midwives Act, 1902 (2 Edw. 7, c. 17).

A.—Regulating the Proceedings of the Board.

1. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected by ballot at the first meeting of the Board in the month of April in each year, and shall hold office until the first meeting in the month of April in the year following.

2. Honorary Treasurer.—An Honorary Treasurer may be elected by ballot from among the members of the Board at their first meeting in the month of April in each year, and if appointed shall hold office until the first meeting in the month of April in the year following.

3. Casual Vacancies.—Should the office of Chairman fall vacant during the year, it shall be filled by election at the next meeting of the Board, and the member so elected shall hold office for the remainder of the year for which his predecessor was elected. A vacancy in the office of Honorary Treasurer shall be filled in the same manner, should the Board so determine.

4. Meetings.—The Board shall meet on the last Thursday in each month, unless otherwise decided at the previous meeting, and at such other times as may be necessary. The Chairman may at any time convene a meeting of the Board, and the Secretary shall convene a meeting if required to do so by any three members of the Board by writing under their hands.

5. Notice.—Not less than four days' notice of any meeting shall be given to each member of the Board, directed to such address as he or she may from time to time furnish to the Secretary.

6. Quorum.—The quorum of the Board shall be four.

7. Order of Business.—The order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1) Minutes of the last meeting.
- (2) Correspondence.
- (3) Statement of accounts.
- (4) Bills and claims.
- (5) Reports of Committees.
- (6) Business directly arising under the Act.
- (7) Notices of motion.
- (8) Any other business.
- (9) Date of next meeting.

Provided that the Board may at any meeting vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

8. Absence of Chairman.—In the event of the Chairman not being present at any meeting of the Board, the chair shall be taken by the Honorary Treasurer; and if neither the Honorary Treasurer nor the Chairman be present, the Board shall elect a presiding chairman for that meeting.

9. Agenda.—No business which is not upon the agenda paper shall be discussed at any meeting of the Board (except routine business) unless the Chairman shall declare such business to be of an urgent nature, and shall be supported by two thirds of the members present and voting.

10. Voting.—Every question, the manner of voting on which is not otherwise specified in these rules, shall be decided on a show of hands by a majority of members present and voting, but any member may call for a division, in which case the names for and against shall be taken down in writing and entered on the minutes. In the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

11. Motions.—Every motion or amendment shall be moved and seconded, and shall be reduced to writing and handed to the Chairman (if so required by him), and shall be read before it is further discussed or put to the meeting.

12. Notices of Motion.—Every notice of motion shall be in writing, signed by the member giving the notice, and shall be given or sent to the Secretary of the Board, who shall insert in the agenda papers for any meeting of the Board all notices of motion which he may have received prior to the day on which the agenda paper is sent out to members, in the order in which they have been received by him.

13. Rescinding of Resolution.—No resolution of the Board shall be altered or rescinded at a subsequent meeting except after fourteen days' notice.

14. Committees.—Every committee appointed by the Board shall make a report of its proceedings to the Board, and the recommendations of every committee shall, so far as practicable, be in the form of resolutions, to be considered by the Board: and the acts and proceedings of every committee shall be submitted to the Board for approval, unless the resolution of the Board appointing the committee shall otherwise direct in respect of all or any of the matters referred to it.

15. Reports.—Every report from a committee shall be submitted by the chairman of the committee (if present) who shall move that it be received by the Board, and on the motion being carried, the chairman, or any other member of the committee, may move to agree with the resolutions of the committee, and such resolutions shall be considered seriatim. And the question that the report (if necessary, as amended) be now approved shall be put from the chair, but no debate shall be allowed thereon.

16. Bills and Claims.—All bills and claims shall be examined by the Secretary, and if allowed by the Board shall be initiated by the presiding Chairman.

17. Cheques.—All cheques for the payment of money shall be signed by two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary.

18. Financial Statement.—At every ordinary meeting of the Board the Secretary shall present a statement in writing showing the receipts and expenditure of the Board, including balances brought forward since the last ordinary meeting, and showing the existing balance, if any, to the credit of the Board, and the existing liabilities.

19. Decision of Chairman. — The presiding Chairman shall decide upon any point of order or procedure, and his decision shall be final.

**B.**—Regulating the issue of Certificates and the conditions of admission to the Roll of Midwives.

1. Candidates must satisfy the Central Midwives Board that they have reached a sufficient standard of general education, and submit the following documents, duly filled in and signed:—

(a) A certificate of birth showing that the candidate is not under twenty-one years of age;

(b) Certificates to the effect that the candidate has undergone the training set forth in C 1 (1) (2) and (3)—

(c) A certificate of good moral character. This certificate must be in the form prescribed by the Central Midwives Board. The person signing must state in the certificate that he or she has known the candidate for at least twelve months, and must append to his or her signature a statement of his or her calling or position. (Schedule, Form I.)

2. Candidates must pass an examination as hereinafter set forth. (See C. below.)

3. A candidate who has complied with the above requirements and has successfully passed the examination shall receive a certificate in the form set out in the Schedule and her name shall be entered by the Secretary on the Roll of Midwives (Schedule, Form II.)

4. The names of all women admitted to the Roll of Midwives under section 6 (1) and (2) of the Midwives Act shall be printed in one single list and in alphabetical order.

**C.**—Regulating the Course of Training and the Conduct of Examinations, and the Remuneration of the Examiners.

1. No person shall be admitted to an examination unless she produces certificates that she has undergone the following course of training, viz:—

(1) She must have, under supervision satisfactory to the Central Midwives Board, attended and watched the progress of not fewer than twenty labours, making abdominal and vaginal examinations during the course of labour and personally delivering the patient. (Schedule, Form III.)

(2) She must have to the satisfaction of the person certifying nursed twenty lying-in women during the ten days following labour. (Schedule, Form IV.)

The certificates as to (1) and (2) must be in the form prescribed by the Central Midwives Board, and must be filled up and signed either by a registered medical practitioner or by the Chief Midwife or in the absence of such an officer by the matron of an institution recognized by the Board, or in the case of a poor law institution by the matron being a Midwife certified under the Midwives Act or a superintendent nurse certified in like manner and appointed under the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897, and attached to such an institution, or by a Midwife certified under the Midwives Act and approved by the Board for the purpose.

(3) She must have attended a sufficient course of instruction in the subjects named below. (See Section 4 C)

No period of less than three months shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose.

The above certificate (3) must be in the form prescribed by the Central Midwives Board, and must be filled up and signed by a registered medical practitioner recognized by the Board as a teacher. (Schedule, Form V.)

2. Candidates who intend to present themselves for examination must send notice to the Secretary of the Central Midwives Board at least three weeks before the date fixed for the examination to commence, accompanied by the certificates mentioned in B. 1 and C. 1, and by the payment of the fee of one guinea, or, in the event of the candidate having presented herself on a former occasion and having failed to pass, the fee of fifteen shillings.

3. Any candidate who during the examination shows a want of acquaintance with the ordinary subjects of elementary education may be rejected on that ground alone.

4. The Examination shall be partly oral and practical, and partly written, and shall embrace the following subjects:—

- (a) The elementary anatomy of the female pelvis and generative organs.
- (b) Pregnancy and its principal complications, including abortion.
- (c) The symptoms, mechanism, course and management of natural labour.
- (d) The signs that a labour is abnormal.
- (e) Hæmorrhage: its varieties and the treatment of each.
- (f) Antiseptics in Midwifery and the way to prepare and use them.
- (g) The management of the puerperal patient, including the use of the clinical thermometer and of the catheter.
- (h) The management (including the feeding) of infants, and the signs of the important diseases which may develop during the first ten days.
- (i) The duties of the Midwife as described in the regulations.
- (j) Obstetric emergencies, and how the Midwife should deal with them until the arrival of a doctor. This will include some knowledge of the drugs commonly needed in such cases, and of the mode of their administration. (See E. 16.)
- (k) Puerperal fever, its nature causes and symptoms. The elements of house sanitation. The disinfection of person, clothing, and appliances.

5. Due notice shall be given of the examinations to be held under the Act.

6. The remuneration of the Examiners shall be such as may from time to time be recommended by the Central Midwives Board and approved by the Privy Council.

#### D.—Regulating the Admission to the Roll of Women already in Practice as Midwives at the passing of the Act.

1. Applications for admission to the Roll of Midwives under Section 2 of the Midwives Act must be made on the prescribed forms (Schedule, Forms VI, VIII), and must be forwarded to the Central Midwives Board together with such one or more of the following certificates as may be required.

2. In the case of women claiming admission on the ground of having obtained a certificate in midwifery from the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland, the Obstetrical Society of London, the Coombe Lying-in Hospital and Guinness's Dispensary, or the Rotunda Hospital for the Relief of the Poor Lying-in Women of Dublin (a) either the original certificate on which the application is based or in the event of the original certificate having been lost, a voucher from the accredited secretary or other agent of the certifying body to the effect that a certificate was granted to the applicant on such and such a date; and (b) a certificate signed by a Justice of the Peace, minister of religion or registered medical practitioner, or the secretary of an institution (approved by the Central Midwives Board) of which the applicant is a member, or is or was an employee, stating that the applicant is the person to whom the aforementioned Certificate in Midwifery was granted. The Secretary of the Board shall, by comparison of the handwriting, or by such enquiry as he may think necessary, satisfy

himself as far as possible of the applicant's identity. The application must be accompanied by the fee of ten shillings.

3. In the case of women claiming admission on the ground of having obtained a Certificate in Midwifery from any institution or examining body other than those specified in Section 2 of the Midwives Act, the certificate on which the application is based, together with satisfactory evidence in the form prescribed by the Central Midwives Board (Schedule, Form VII), to the effect that before the certificate was granted the applicant had received a proper course of instruction and training (including personal attendance, under competent supervision, upon at least twenty cases during and after labour), and had passed an examination in Midwifery and the duties of a Midwife, and that the institution or examining body by which the certificate was granted considers the applicant at the present time to be a proper person to be admitted to the Midwives Roll. The application must be accompanied by a fee of ten shillings.

The applicant may be required to furnish other documents or particulars to enable the Board to decide whether the application can be granted.

4. In the case of women claiming admission on the ground of having been in bonâ fide practice as Midwives for twelve months previous to the thirty-first July, one thousand nine hundred and two, a certificate to the effect that the applicant has to the personal knowledge of the person signing been in bonâ fide practice as a midwife for at least twelve months prior to the thirty-first July, one thousand nine hundred and two, and that she is trustworthy, sober, and of good moral character. This certificate must be in the form given in the Schedule (Form IX), must be signed by a Justice of the Peace, minister of religion, registered medical practitioner, or other person acceptable to the Board, and must be accompanied by the fee of ten shillings.

5. The certificates to be issued by the Board under this section will be in the prescribed forms (Schedule, Forms X, XI).

*Note.*—No application for admission to the Roll of Midwives under section 2 of the Midwives Act, 1902, can be received after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five.

#### E.—Regulating, Supervising, and Restricting within due limits the Practice of Midwives.

##### Directions to Midwives.

1. The midwife must be scrupulously clean in every way, because the smallest particle of decomposing matter may set up puerperal fever. She must wear a dress of washable material, and over it a clean washable apron.

*Note.*—It is best to have the sleeves of the dress made so that the midwife can tuck them well up above the elbows.

A midwife who is attending a case in which there are foul-smelling discharges must not go direct to another case without first changing her dress and thoroughly cleansing and disinfecting her hands and forearms and such appliances (2 (a) below) as she may have had occasion to use, and is obliged to take with her.

*Note.*—Unless the cleansing process be thoroughly carried out there will be, even after a healthy confinement, remains of blood, lochia, or liquor amnii on the fingers, and especially under the nails, which will there undergo decomposition, and so become

dangerous to the next patient attended. The midwife must, therefore, keep her nails cut short, and preserve the skin of her hands as far as possible from chaps and other injuries.

2. When called to a confinement a midwife must take with her :—

- (a) An appliance for giving vaginal injections, an appliance for giving enemata, a catheter, a pair of scissors, a clinical thermometer, and a nail-brush.
- (b) An efficient antiseptic for disinfecting the hands, &c.
- (c) An antiseptic for douching in special cases.
- (d) An antiseptic lubricant for smearing the fingers, catheters, douche nozzles, and enema nozzles before they touch the patient.

3. On each occasion of touching the genital organs or their neighbourhood the midwife must previously disinfect her hands and forearms.

4. All instruments and other appliances brought into contact with the patient's generative organs must be properly disinfected.

5. Whenever a midwife has been in attendance upon a patient suffering from puerperal fever, or from any other illness supposed to be infectious, she must disinfect herself and all her instruments and other appliances, to the satisfaction of the local sanitary authority, and must have her clothing thoroughly disinfected before going to another labour. Unless otherwise directed by the local supervising authority, all washable clothing should be boiled, and other clothing should be sent to be stoved (by the local sanitary authority), and then exposed freely to the open air for several days.

#### Duties to Patient.

6. If a midwife has charge of a lying-in case she must not leave the patient after the commencement of the second stage, and she must stay with the woman until the expulsion of the afterbirth, and as long after as may be necessary. In cases where a doctor has been sent for on account of the labour being abnormal or of there being threatened danger, she must await his arrival and faithfully carry out his instructions, (See Clauses 12 and 17 below.)

7. Before making the first internal examination, and always before passing a catheter, the midwife must wash the patient's external parts with soap and water, and then swab them with an antiseptic solution. For this purpose, and for washing the external parts immediately after labour and during the lying-in, on no account must ordinary sponges or flannels be used, but material which can be boiled before use and thrown away afterwards, such as linen, cotton wool, cotton waste, tow, &c.

8. No more internal examinations should be made than are absolutely necessary.

9. On the birth of a child which is in danger of death, the midwife shall inform one of the parents of the child's condition.

10. The midwife must remove soiled linen, blood, feces, urine, and the placenta from the neighbourhood of the patient and from the lying-in room as soon as possible after the labour, and in every case before she leaves the patient's house.

11. The midwife shall be responsible for the cleanliness, and shall give full directions for securing the comfort and proper dieting of the mother and child during the lying-in period, which shall be held, for the purpose of these regulations and in a normal case, to mean the time occupied by the labour and a period of ten days thereafter. (See clause 17 (c).)

12. A "case of normal labour" in these regulations shall mean a labour in which there are

none of the conditions specified in clause 17 below.

#### Duties to Child.

13. In the case of a child being born apparently dead, the midwife should carry out the methods of resuscitation which have been taught her.

14. As soon as the child's head is born, and if possible before the eyes are opened, its eyelids should be carefully cleansed with a suitable antiseptic lotion.

#### General.

15. No midwife shall undertake the duty of laying out the dead, or follow any occupation that is in its nature liable to be a source of infection.

16. A midwife must enter in a book, with other notes of the case, all occasions on which she is under the necessity of administering any drug, whether scheduled as a poison or not, the dose, and the time and cause of its administration.

17. In all cases of abortion, of illness of the patient or child, or of any abnormality occurring during pregnancy, labour, or lying-in, a midwife must decline to attend alone, and must advise that a registered medical practitioner be sent for, as for example, under the following circumstances :—

(a) In the case of a pregnant woman :—

(1) When she suspects a deformed pelvis.

(2) When there is loss of blood.

(3) When the pregnancy presents any other unusual feature (as, for example, excessive sickness, persistent headache, dimness of vision, puffiness of face and hands, difficulty in emptying the bladder, incontinence of urine, large varicose veins, rupture), or when it is complicated by fever or any other serious condition.

(b) In the case of a woman in labour :—

(1) In all presentations other than the uncomplicated vertex or breech; in all cases of breech presentation in primiparæ; in all cases of flooding and convulsions; and also whenever there appears to be insufficient room for the child to pass, or when a tumour is felt in any part of the mother's passages.

(2) If the midwife when the cervix has become dilated is unable to make out the presentation.

(3) If there is loss of blood in excess of what is natural, at whatever time of the labour it may occur.

(4) If an hour after the birth of the child the placenta has not been expelled, and cannot be expressed (*i.e.*, pressed out), even if no bleeding has occurred.

(5) In cases of rupture of the perinæum, or other serious injury of the soft parts.

(c) In the case of lying-in women, and in the case of newly-born children :—

Whenever, after delivery, the progress of the woman or child is not satisfactory, but in all events upon the occurrence of the subjoined conditions in—

(1) *The Mother* :

(1) Abdominal swelling and signs of insufficient contraction of the uterus.

(2) Foul-smelling discharges.

(3) Secondary post-partum hæmorrhage.

(4) Rigor.

(5) Rise of temperature above 100° 4' F. with quickening of the pulse for more than 24 hours.

(6) Unusual swelling of the breasts with local tenderness or pain.



(II) *The Child:*

- (1) Injuries received during birth.
- (2) Obvious malformations or deformities, not inconsistent with continued existence.
- (3) Concealed malformations—Incapacity to suck or take nourishment.
- (4) Inflammation to even the slightest degree of the eyes, eye-lids, and ears.
- (5) Syphilitic appearance of the skin in certain parts.
- (6) Illness or feebleness arising from pre-maturity.
- (7) Malignant jaundice (icterus neonatorum).
- (8) Inflammation about the umbilicus (septic infection of the cord).
- (d) In all cases of the death of a woman during pregnancy labour or lying in.

When a registered medical practitioner is sent for, the midwife must state in writing the condition of the patient and the reason of the necessity for medical advice, in accordance with Clause 19 (b) below).

18. Notification.

(1) *Deaths.*—In all cases in which the death of the mother or of the child occurs before the attendance of a registered medical practitioner the midwife shall, as soon as possible after the death, notify the same to the local supervising authority.

(2) *Stillbirths.*—In all cases where a registered medical practitioner is not in attendance the midwife shall, as soon as possible after the occurrence of a stillbirth, notify the same to the local supervising authority.

A child is deemed to be stillborn when it has not breathed or shown any sign of life after being completely born.

(3) *Puerperal Fever and other Infectious Diseases.*—These cases are included in the notice required when medical help is sent for. (See 19 (b) below.)

19. A midwife shall keep the following records:—

(a) A register of cases, in the following form:—

The midwife shall make two copies of the above (b) by means of transfer paper or otherwise; she shall preserve one of these copies for herself, and shall send the other by post to the local supervising authority within twelve hours. (See clause 18 (3), above.)

*The Midwife is also recommended to keep a Case Book with fuller details.*

20. The supervising authority shall make arrangements to secure a proper inspection of every midwife's case book, bag of appliances, &c., and, when thought necessary, an inspection of her place of residence, and an investigation of her mode of practice.

21. Nothing in this section (E) shall apply to certified Midwives exercising their calling in Hospitals, Workhouses, or Poor Law Infirmaries under the supervision of a duly appointed medical officer.

F.—Deciding the Conditions under which Midwives may be suspended from practice.

In carrying out section 8 (3) of the Midwives Act it shall be the duty of the local supervising authority to suspend a midwife from practice who contravenes the directions for the use of disinfectants and for the employment of proper safeguards against the spread of infection, and any other rules for the purpose laid down by the Central Midwives Board, and in the exercise of that duty the local supervising authority shall, after communicating their decision in writing to the midwife concerned, at once report any suspension (with the grounds thereof) to the Central Midwives Board.

N.B.—In carrying out section 8 (3) of the Midwives Act, 1902, the local supervising authority shall forthwith report any suspension to the Central Midwives Board.

G.—Defining the Particulars required to be given in any Notice under section ten of the Act.

The particulars required to be given in any notice under section 10 of the Midwives Act, 1902, shall be as follows:—

- (1) The number and date of the certificate granted by the Central Midwives Board to the person giving the notice.
- (2) Her Christian name and surname in full, and if married since the grant of her certificate, the name under which it was granted to her.
- (3) Her usual place of residence, and if she carries on her practice elsewhere, the address also where she practises.
- (4) If she practises or acts as a midwife outside the area within which she usually resides or carries on her practice, the date and address at which she commenced to practise or pursue her calling without such area.
- (5) The notice shall be in the prescribed Form (Schedule, Form XII).

## BOROUGH OF WALSALL.

The Tramways Act, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Walsall, acting by the Council of the said borough, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, on the tenth day of August, 1903, made the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to the Walsall Corporation Tramways, namely:—

(a.) BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Council as the Local Authority.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 10 yards.

3. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 2 and 4, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made: Provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

4. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

5. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car so being driven.

6. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

7. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

8. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, 1904.

(b.) BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Council as the Promoters of the Tramways.

1. In these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "Corporation" shall mean the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, the term "tramways" shall mean the tramways of which the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses are Promoters under the powers of the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Walsall Corporation Act, 1900; the term "car" shall mean any carriage using the tramway for passenger traffic; the term "passenger" shall mean every person being conveyed or attempting to be conveyed by a car, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

2. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car using the tramways, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to

make Bye-laws or Regulations under the Tramways Act, 1870.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise, except with the permission of the conductor.

4. No passenger shall spit in or on any car, or smoke inside any car.

5. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or make any other noise objectionable to passengers.

6. A person in a state of intoxication or affected with any infectious or contagious disease shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger, and any offender shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice or any advertisement in or on the car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car, or touch, handle or interfere with any electric machine or appliance in under upon or about any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

9. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car, and shall not enter or be or remain upon any part thereof after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any car, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

10. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, and accept a ticket corresponding thereto.

11. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do to the inspector or conductor, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

12. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Walsall Corporation Act, 1900, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

13. Personal luggage, not exceeding 28 pounds in weight (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers), shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform.

14. No passenger or other person not being an Officer employed in connection with the tramway

undertaking of the Corporation shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any car, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

15. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

16. No person shall enter, or mount, or attempt to enter or mount any car arriving or standing at a terminus, or stopping place, until such passengers as may be upon the car and as desire to dismount, shall have had a reasonable opportunity of doing so.

17. When any car contains the full number of passengers, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such car when warned by the conductor not to do so.

18. When a car contains the full number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the car.

19. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the full number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a car.

20. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car whilst in motion.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded fire-arms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

24. The conductor of each car shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

26. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

27. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, 1904.

*Cumberland*.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Allerdale Below Derwent, Keswick, Derwent (including its detached part), Maryport, and Workington, and the parishes of Harrington, Distington, Parton, Moresby, Hensingham, Weddicar, Arlecdon, Salter and Eskett, and Lamplugh, in the administrative county of Cumberland; and also comprising the boroughs of Whitehaven and Workington (27 May, 1903).

*Gloucestershire*.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Cirencester (except the parishes of Winstone, Syde, Brimpsfield, Elkstone, Colesborne, and Rendcomb), Stroud (except the parishes of Miserden, Cranham, Painswick, Pitchcombe, and Whiteshill), Nails-

worth, and Tetbury (except the parish of Didmarton), and the parish of King's Stanley, in the administrative county of Gloucester (15 May, 1903).

*Isle of Wight*.—An Area comprising the administrative county of the Isle of Wight, including the boroughs of Newport and Ryde (4 June, 1903).

*Midlothian and Peebles*.—An Area comprising the parishes of Inveresk, Newton, Liberton, Dalkeith, Cranston, Newbattle, Cockpen, Lasswade, Glencorse, Penicuik, Carrington, Borthwick, Urichton, Temple, and Heriot, in Midlothian; and the parishes of Linton, Newlands, Eddleston, Innerleithen, Kirkurd, Lyne, Skirling, and such portions of the parishes of Stobo, Broughton Glenholm and Kilbucho, and Peebles as lie to the north of the Caledonian and North British Railways, in the administrative county of Peebles; and also comprising the burgh of Musselburgh (13 August, 1903).
