When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

17. So soon as a car shall contain the full number of passengers authorized for conveyance thereby, a notice to the effect that the complement is complete shall be exhibited by the conductor on the near side thereof, and thereupon no person shall be permitted to enter upon the car until accommodation can be provided. Any person who may have entered or mounted a car which shall contain the authorized number of passengers, shall leave the same immediately upon the request of the conductor or other authorized servant of the Corporation, and on his refusal to do so he shall immediately be removed by or under the direction of the Corporation.

Entering or leaving Car in motion.

18. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car whilst in motion.

Disabled Cars.

19. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor or other authorized servant of the Corporation, leave the car, and if such passengers shall have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available car. No person shall, except with the permission of the Corporation, mount or enter a disabled or damaged car.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

20. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Dogs.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car, in contravention of this Bye-

law shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor or other authorized servant of the Corporation.

Firearms, &c.

22. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

23. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other authorized servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall signal a car to start or stop.

Obstruction.

24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

25. Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent any breach thereof.

Penalty.

26. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of, any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Operation.

27. These Bye-laws shall come into force on Thursday, the fifteenth day of October, 1903.

28. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws.
