TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 17th instant.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 17th September, 1903, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 17th March, 1904.
3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*
4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Saturday, the 12th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Thursday, the 17th instant.
6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PORT OF STORNOWAY.

Limits of Port.

We, the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," appoint Stornoway to continue and be a port in that part of the United Kingdom called Scotland, and do hereby declare that the limits of the said port shall include the whole of the chain or cluster of islands known as the Outer Hebrides or Long Island extending from the northernmost point of the Butt of Lewis to Barra Head the southern extremity of the Island of Beneray, and shall extend seawards to a distance of three miles from a supposed line encircling all the said chain or cluster of islands (other than those hereinafter named) not nearer than low water mark from any part of the shores thereof, and encircling all King's Chambers, bays, channels, harbours, voes, creeks, and sounds thereto, or to any part thereof belonging, as indicated by the dotted lines on the plan hereto annexed; and the said port shall also include the following islands lying more or less adjacent to the said chain or cluster, namely, the Shiant Islands to the east, the Islands of Rona and Suisker to the north, the Flannan Islands, the Islands of Boreway and St. Kilda, the Islet of Gasker or Sauskeir, and the Islands of Monach and Hasker, all to the west, and shall extend seawards to a distance of three miles from low water mark from the several shores of the same, and include all bays, channels, voes, creeks, and sounds thereto belonging.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do hereby annul all former limits of the Port of Stornoway.
