THIRSK AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1903.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the district described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of

the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the THIRSK AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1903.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Bye-laws were made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Leicester, acting by the Council as the Local Authority under and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Leicester Corporation Act, 1902, at a Meeting of the Council, held at the Town Hall, in the said Borough, on Tuesday, the twenty-ninth day of September, 1903.

Interpretation.

1. In these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Leicester; the word "tramways" means the tramways of the Corporation within the said borough, and the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the said tramways for the conveyance of passengers.

Bye-laws to apply to streets in which tramways are laid.

2. These Bye-laws shall extend and apply to all streets within the Borough of Leicester in which tramways are laid.

Regulation of slow-going traffic.

3. (i.)—The expression "slow-going traffic" as used in this Bye-law includes all vehicles used for carrying goods proceeding at a slower rate of speed than a car, or standing, also cattle, sheep, or other animals driven along the streets.

(ii.) The driver of any slow-going traffic shall keep the same as near to the kerb of the foot pavement as is possible, unless sufficient reason be shown to the contrary.

(iii.) The driver of any slow-going traffic in the centre of the street shall, as soon as possible, upon warning being given by the driver of a car, either by ringing a bell or by blowing a whistle, draw to the side of the street so as to admit of the car passing, unless in the case of any such traffic proceeding in the same direction as such car, the driver can quicken the pace so as to keep clear of the car.

(iv.) At crossings of streets the drivers of slow-going traffic which may have to be brought to a stand shall keep such traffic to the side of the street, and shall keep it in its own line in crossing a street or turning from one street into another.

No person to obstruct Car.

4. (i.)—No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any car.

Vehicle not to obstruct Car.

(ii.) The driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable dispatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

Vehicle standing in street.

5. When it is necessary that a vehicle should stand in the street the person in charge thereof shall cause it to be drawn close to the kerb, and shall not keep it there for a longer time than is reasonably necessary. The person in charge of a standing vehicle which is obstructing the traffic shall on the order of any Police Constable move it to some place where it will not cause obstruction.

Vehicle breaking down in street.

6. In the event of any vehicle breaking down in any street or any load falling from a vehicle,

the person in charge of the vehicle shall immediately remove the vehicle or load from the street.

Driver of vehicle to signal before turning out of line of traffic.

7. The driver of any vehicle who intends to turn out of the line of traffic in which he is then driving shall, when practicable, give a signal by holding up his hand to other drivers who may be following him.

Penalty.

8. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of the Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Repeal of existing Bye-laws, rules, and regulations.

9. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, the Bye-laws made on the 28th day of September, 1875, and the Rules and Regulations made on the 25th day of January, 1876, by the Corporation acting as the Local Authority of the said Borough under the powers conferred by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Public Health Act, 1875, shall be repealed.

Operation.

10. These Bye-laws shall come into force on Monday, the first day of February, 1904.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws were made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Leicester, being the Promoters of the Leicester Corporation Tramways, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act 1870, at a Meeting of the Council, held at the Town Hall in the said Borough, on Tuesday, the twenty-ninth day of September, 1903.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Leicester; the word "tramways" means the tramway system worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the borough of Leicester or in any other district; the words "Tramways Committee" mean the Committee appointed by the Corporation for the time being to undertake the control and management of the tramways; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Tramways Committee having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Tramways Committee driving or helping to drive a car.

Entering and leaving Cars.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to board a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall before doing so permit all persons to alight who may so desire.

Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, or cigar, or cigarette, inside any car, nor in front of the trolley pole on the top of any car.

Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxicated Persons.

5. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

Obscene or Offensive Language, &c.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance, in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Damage to Car.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number-plate printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any car.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

8. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded.

No child under six years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

Payment into Box.

10. Each passenger, when tickets are not issued, shall, during each stage of the journey for which a fare is payable, pay into the box provided for the purpose the fare so payable, and any such fare shall be in respect of and for the stage of the journey only for which it is paid, and for no other stage thereof.

Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any duly authorized officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

A ticket shall not be transferable, and shall only be available by the car on which, and for the stage of the journey for which it is issued.

Luggage.

12. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

Disabled Cars.

13. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

14. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to or from a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Travelling on steps, &c.

15. No person other than the driver or the conductor of a car, or a servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride upon the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or shall stand on the outside, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Full number of Passengers.

16. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

Entering or leaving Car in motion.

17. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car whilst in motion.

Dogs.

18. No person shall take a dog or other animal in or on any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

19. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

20. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and no

person other than the conductor, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall signal a car to start.

Obstruction.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

22. Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent the breach thereof.

Removal of person infringing Bye-laws.

23. Any person who shall whilst on any car commit any legal offence or any breach of these Bye-laws shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of the fare so paid or any part thereof.

Copy of Bye-laws to be kept in Cars.
24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

Penalty.

25. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of, any of the Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Repeal of existing Bye-laws.

26. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, the Bye-laws made by the Leicester Tramways Company under the powers conferred by the Tramways Act, 1870, which came into force on the 20th day of December, 1875, shall be repealed.

Operation.

27. These Bye-laws shall come into force on Monday, the first day of February, 1904.
