Naval Uniform.

In pursuance of His Majesty's pleasure the gold-braided blue evening waistcoat for Officers of the Royal Navy has been abolished, and a plain blue evening waistcoat has been substituted for it.

Naval Officers are to wear:—

With No. 6 ("Mess Dress"): the white evening waistcoat alreading worn only with No. 2 ("Ball Dress") and with No. 9 ("White Mess Dress") when the Kamarband is not worn.

With No. 7 ("Mess Undress"): the plain blue evening waistcoat, which is also to be worn with No. 10 ("White Mess Undress") when the Kamarband is not worn.

Both white and blue evening waistcoats are in future to be made with a plain roll collar, but Officers may wear the present pattern white waistcoat and the blue waistcoat with the gold braid removed until new ones are required.
