BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Appointed Day.

Order made under Article 2 of the Yeovil (Extension) Order, 1903.

Whereas by Section 1 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as the Act) it is amongst other things enacted that the Council of a borough with a population of over ten thousand shall, as respects that borough, be the Local Education Authority for the purpose of Part III of the Act.

And whereas by Sub-section (8) of Section 23 of the Act it is enacted that population for the purposes of the Act shall be calculated according to the census of nineteen hundred and one.

And whereas by the Yeovil (Extension) Order, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as the Order) it is provided that the boundary of the Borough of Yeovil, which was at the date of the confirmation of the Order a borough having a population of less than ten thousand, shall be altered so as to include certain areas in the Order referred to as the Added Areas.

And whereas the population of the Borough of Yeovil as extended by the Order was at the date of the census of nineteen hundred and one over ten thousand.

And whereas by Article 2 of the Order it is provided that for the purposes and provisions of Part III of the Act the Order shall come into operation on such day as the Board of Education may appoint, such day being not more than eighteen months later than the date of the Act of Parliament confirming the Order.

And whereas the Order was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 13) Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as the Confirming Act).

And whereas the date of the Confirming Act was the eleventh day of August, nineteen hundred and three.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Order and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the Council of the Borough of Yeovil for the purposes and provisions of Part III of the Act, the first day of January, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board may hereafter appoint.
