PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of an Act of the six and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty sixth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words and figures

following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Foleshill in the county of Warwick now vested

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the twentieth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four made between John Rotherham and Richard Kevitt Rotherham of the first part Charlotte Rotherham Widow and the said John Rotherham and Richard Kevitt Rotherham of the second part John Soden of the third part Robert Soden of the fourth part Elizabeth Soden Spinster of the fifth part Mary Soden Spinster of the sixth part Sarah Soden Spinster of the sixth part Sarah Soden Spinster of the sixth part Sarah Soden Spinster of the seventh part Thomas Spooner Soden of the eighth part the Reverend Daniel Ledsam of the ninth part Charles Hopkins and Sarah his wife of the tenth part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the eleventh part the lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereunto annexed became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 8th beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

#### Resignation of Certificates.

#### COAL MINES REGULATION ACT, 1896.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that he has this day made an Order under section 6 of the Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1896, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of 10th December, 1903," the effect of which is to add a new explosive, Ammonal, to the list of Permitted Explosives, and to authorize the use of the explosives Bobbinite, Faversham Powder, and Geloxite, which already appear in the list, in an altered form. The use of a detonator for firing Bobbinite is by the new definition of that explosive expressly prohibited.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Lancaster) Order, 1903.

Dated 7th December, 1903.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Lancaster, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County of Lancaster) Order, 1903.

#### BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Lancaster to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed or Blackheaded Bunting, Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Hedge Sparrow, Hobby, Kestrel, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Longtailed Tit, Tree Creeper, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Wheatear, Whinchat, Wren, Wryneck.

Other Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880

III. Except in the Hundred of Amounderness and that portion of the county of Lancaster known as Lonsdale South of the Sands, the provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster, to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Blackbird, Heron, Song Thrush, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat.

All Birds protected during the whole of the Year within a certain Area.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1830, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited in such portion of the River Mersey between the city of Liverpool and the county borough of Warrington, as is within the district of the Administrative County of Lancaster. This area is shown in pink on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, and dated the 7th December, 1903.

#### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster:—

Bittern, Buzzard, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Blackheaded Gull, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Mallard, Merlin, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl, Golden Plover, Raven, Sheldrake, Snipe, Teal, Tern, Widgeon,

Woodcock, Woodpecker, Wryneck, and (after May 1st):—Lapwing, Peewit, or Green Plover.

Other Eggs protected within a part of the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the Administrative County of Lancaster as lies south of the Ribble:—

Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed or Blackheaded Bunting, Tree Creeper, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Hawfinch, Linnet, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Skylark, Stonechat, Longtailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodlark, Wren.

#### Repeal of former Order

VII. The Order of the 27th August, 1902, is hereby repealed.
