The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated January 15, from His Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following translation of a Circular issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, respecting quarantine restrictions to be imposed on arrivals from Egypt :---In consequence of cessation of cholera and

plague in Egypt, the Marine Board orders that

henceforth arrivals from Egypt supplied with clean bill of health will only be subject to medical observation, ordered by Government decree of December 28, 1889, No. 14,968, against arrivals from Turkey, Greece, and from North Africa.

Should, however, such arrivals have unclean bill of health, the respective vessels will have to be treated according to Government Circular of November 5, 1900, No. 13,835, and respectively of June 23, 1901, No. 7,805.

This is made known, in addition to abovementioned Circulars, for information and guidance. Trieste, January 11, 1904.

BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by an Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by an Order dated the twentysecond day of December, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for each of the Councils of the Counties, County Borough, and Urban District named in the Schedule to this Order for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the first day of February, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such other purpose or provision for any such Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for each of the said Councils for all such other purposes and provisions the first day of April, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board may for any such other purpose or provision for any such Council bereafter appoint.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appoint-ment of Stocktaker: Workhouse and Cottage Homes) :-

ELHAM UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Elham Union :--

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Elham Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board dated the 14th day of September, 1889, similar requirements are made with respect to certain Accounts prescribed by that Order for the Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse and Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :-

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Elham Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.-Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ABTICLE III.-No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV .--- The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and Cottage Homes, and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and

Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account.

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form :-

"Submitted to me this day of , and found to be correct as 19 regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed)..... "Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.-The Master of the Workhouse and the Superintendent of the Cottage Homes shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse and the Superintendent of the Cottage Homes shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.-So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Orders dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
