Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for setting out and constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes, and annexing such district to the consecrated church of All Saints Stretford situate within the limits of the parish (sometime a district under the said Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850) of Saint Matthew Stretford within the original limits of the parish of Manchester in the county of Lancaster and diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district for spiritual purposes comprising a part of the said parish of Saint Matthew Stretford shall be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of All Saints Stretford which church was not consecrated under the provisions of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her

said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Saint Matthew Stretford which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be severed and disannexed from the said parish of Saint Matthew Stretford and shall be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of All Saints Stretford and shall become and be a district for spiritual purposes and shall be named 'The District of All Saints Stretford.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinnamed Acts or of either of them or of any other

Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints Stretford being :-"All that part of the parish (sometime district under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850) of Saint Matthew Stretford in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin Davyhulme, and partly by the new parish of Saint Catherine, Barton-upon-Irwell, upon part of the north-east by the district of Saint Cuthbert, Old Trafford, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say upon the remaining part of the north-east upon the south-east, upon the south and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Cuthbert Old Trafford from the said parish of Saint Matthew Stretford at the point in the Duke of Bridgewater's Canal which is called Waters Meeting and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of thirty-nine chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries the said canal over Longford Brook and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said brook for a distance of seventeen chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such brook is crossed by the middle of the line of the Manchester South Junction and Altrincham Railway and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of thirty-five

chains or thereabouts to the point (near the southern end of Stretford Railway Station) opposite to the middle of Radnor-street and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of Radnor-street (thereby crossing the Duke of Bridgewater's Canal) for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the junction of such street with Chester-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Chester-road for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Herbertstreet and extending theuce north-westward along the middle of Herbert-street for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cyprus-street and extending thence south-west-ward along the middle of Cyprus-street for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with School-road, and extending thence westward along the middle of School-road for a distance of twenty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Barton-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Barton-road for a distance of sixty-five chains or thereabouts to the point where such road crosses the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Matthew, Stretford, from the said new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Davyhulme.'

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbent of the parish out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.
