WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Lingfield in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas the Reverend Wilmot Guy Bryan of the vicarage Lingfield in the county of Surrey Clerk in Holy Orders in whom is vested the advowson or perpetual right of presentation to the said benefice of Lingfield for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances has contracted with Arthur Day of No. 28, Great George-street in the city of Westminster Gentleman for the sale of the said advowson to the said Arthur Day for the like estate free from incumbrances.

"And whereas the said Arthur Day is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Lingfield now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Rochester for the time being.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Stuart now Bishop of Rochester is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Edward Stuart Bishop of Rochester has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Lingfield which is herein-before mentioned and hereinafter recommended

and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists that is to say in the parish of Lingfield.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Wilmot Guy Bryan and Arthur Day (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said. Edward Stuart Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted ()rder the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation: to the said benefice of Lingfield now vested in them the said Wilmot Guy Bryan and Arthur Day as aforesaid shall be transferred from them to the said Edward Stuart Bishop of Rochester and his successors in the same Bishoprick and shall thereupon and theuceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time; to time be exercised by the said Edward Stuart Bishop of Rochester and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.
