EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, to Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Cousin and Councillor Henry, Duke of Norfolk, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Earl Marshal, and Our Hereditary Marshal of England. Greeting!

Now know ye that We of Our Princely Grace and mere motion are pleased to ordain and declare that each and every of Our Lieutenants of a County and each and every of Our Lieutenants of a Riding or Division of a County in England and Wales, shall during his term of office and within the limits of his jurisdiction have, on all occasions, place, pre-eminence, and precedence before the Sheriff having concurrent jurisdiction in the said County, Riding, or Division.

Our Will and Pleasure, therefore, is that you, Henry, Duke of Norfolk, to whom the cognizance of matters of this nature doth properly belong, do see this Our Order observed and kept, and that you do also cause the same to be recorded in Our College of Arms, to the end that Our Officers of Arms, and all others upon occasion

may take full notice and have knowledge thereof.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this eighteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and four, in the fourth year of Our Reign.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas Douglass Horace Boggis-Rolfe has been duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf to be a District Auditor from and after the eighteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and four:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said Douglass Horace Boggis-Rolfe (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers; namely:—

(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order.

(2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.

(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.

(4.) The Tees Valley Water Board.

(5.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Durham Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, the District or area subject to the jurisdiction of the Water Board named in paragraph (4) of Article I of this Order, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (5) of the said Article.

Vaughan Lewes, D.S.O., His Majesty's ship "Fearless," that he has made a very careful search for the rock, marked doubtful on the Charts and shown at a distance of 5 miles N. 69° E. from the eastern point of Melow Island in the approach to Kudat Bay. The ship was anchored in 13 fathoms in the supposed position, and soundings of not less than 12 fathoms were obtained for a distance of one mile around her in all directions without finding any indication of a shoal, nor was any discoloured water observed from the masthead. The fishermen and local authorities at Kudat, who are intimately acquainted with Marudu Bay, know nothing of the existence of any danger hereabouts.

The above mentioned rock, which was not seen by His Majesty's ship "Egeria" in 1850, was inserted on the Charts from old documents, which probably were not very reliable; it has therefore now been expunged from the Admiralty

publications.
