A PROCLAMATION.

MARIE R.

WHereas Their Majesties have received Information that the Persons herein after particularly Named, have Conspired together, and with divers other disaffected Persons, to Disturb and Destroy Their Government, and for that Purpose have Abetted and Aligned to Their Majesties Enemies: For which Cause several Warrants for High Treason have lately been Issued out against them; but they have withdrawn themselves from their usual Places of Abode, and are Fled from Justice. Their Majesties have therefore thought fit (by the Advice of Their Privy Council) to Issue this Their Royal Proclamation, and Their Majesties do hereby Command and Require all Their Loving Subjects to Discover, Take and Apprehend Robert Earl of Scarisdale, Edward Henry Earl of Litchfield, Edward Lord Griffin, Charles Earl of Newburgh, Charles Earl of Middleton, Charles Earl of Dunmore, Lord Forbes, eldest Son of the Earl of Graynard, James Griffin Esq; Sir John Fenwick, Sir Theophilus Oglethorpe, Sir Andrew Kestler, Colonel Henry Slingsby, James Grahme Esq; Orby, Second Son of Sir Thomas Orby, Deceased; Colonel Edward Sackville, Oliver St. George, Esq; Son of Sir Oliver St. George; Major Thomas Soaper, Charles Adderley Esq; David Lioud Esq; George Porter Esq; Son of Thomas Porter Esq; Deceased, and Edward Stafford Esq; wherever they may be found; and to carry them before the next Justice of Peace, or Chief Magistrate, who is hereby Required to Commit them to the next Goal, there to remain until they be thence Delivered by due Course of Law. And Their Majesties do hereby Require the said Justice, or other Magistrate, immediately to give Notice thereof to Them, or Their Privy Council. And Their Majesties do hereby Publish and Declare to all Persons that shall Conceal the Persons above Named, or any of them, or in Aiding and Assisting in the Concealing of them, or Furthering their Escape, that they shall be proceeded against for such their Offence with the utmost Severity according to Law.

Given at our Court at Whitehall the Ninth day of May, 1692. In the Fourth Year of our Reign.

Rome, April 26. The Cardinal *de Fourbin* has openly declared, that the King his Master will not admit of *Signior Cavalierini* to be Nuncio in France until the Pope has granted his Bulls to all the French Bishops; and has Authorized the Archbishop of *Paris* to receive the usual Oath of them. On the other hand Cardinal *Negroni*, who is lately come from his Bishoprick of *Faenza*, with several other Cardinals have represented to the Pope how prejudicial his compliance with the Court of France in this matter, will be to the Rights of the Church of *Rome*. The Popes Gallies are hastening out, and that which was designed to have carried *Signior Cavalierini* to *Marseilles*, is now ordered to Sail with the rest, to join the *Venetian Fleet* in the *Levant*.

Turin, April 29. Part of the Forces of the *Milano* are said to be on their march hither; and the Germans are also soon expected. The Recruits for the *Liter* are arrived in *Italy*. It is not yet declared

who is to Command them in the room of *General Caraffa*; but there is a discourse that *General Heuster* will be sent hither to supply his place.

Milan, April 29. The German Forces are on their March towards *Piedmont*, in order to open the Campaigne on that side. We have an account from *Final*, that 450 *Neapolitons* are arrived there, to recruit the Regiments of that Nation, in the Service of this State.

Vienna, May 4. The Letters from *Debreczin* of the 25th past, tell us, That they are very busie there in disposing and ordering every thing that is necessary for the Siege of *Great Waradin*; That the German Regiments quartered about *Debreczin*, beg in their march thither on the 21st of April, and several other Regiments both of Horse and Foot, who were quartered at *Guschaw* and other places, were marching likewise to join the Army before *Great Waradin*. That *General Heuster* was expected there the 25th or 30th past; and that in the mean time the Imperialists had raised a new Fort at the Foot of *St. Stephens Hill*, on this side the River *Keres*; and were at work to drain the *Birches* of the Place. The Belieged all this while continue resolute to defend the Fortrels to the last Extremity, and do diligently employ themselves to repair the Breaches that have been made by our Cannon in their Walls and Bastions. They seem, by the continual fire they make upon our men, both with great and small Shot, to be in no want of Ammunition; and we are informed, they have still Bread for two months or six weeks; but they are in great want of all other Provisions, giving for Cows Flesh four Florins, and for Horse Flesh two Florins a Pound. The *Agas* of the *Janisaries* uses all means to quiet and content the Garrison, by assuring them that a considerable body of men is coming to their relief; and by distributing among them some Provisions which he had laid up for his own use. From *Peter Waradin* we have fresh advice, That the Imperialists who are posted on the *Danube* near *Oisowa*, had sunk several Turkish Boats that endeavoured to pass up the River towards *Belgrade*, and had forced divers others to return. Two of the four Vessels, built here to serve on the *Danube* this Summer, are already Launched, and the other two will be ready in few days; they are 142 Foot long, 28 wide, and have two Decks; more of these are building at other places on the *Danube*, and the whole Fleet, which will consist of above 100 Boats great and small, under the Command of the *Marquis de Fleury*, will be ready for Service by the end of this month.

Here is come a report by the way of *Valachia* of the disgrace of the Grand *Vizier*, who they say is Imprisoned, and his Estate Confiscated; and that a *Bassa* in *Mejopotamia* is made choice of to succeed him, and two *Agas* sent for him; but we know not what credit to give to it, till we hear directly from *Constantinople*.

Hydelberg, May 10. The Forces of *Saxony*, which had their Winter quarters hereabouts, and were lately on their march towards the *Mein*, are as we hear, countermanded; and there is a discourse, that the Elector of *Saxony* will send more Troops to reinforce those that are now on the *Rhine*.

Hamburgh, May 13. Their Electoral Highnesses of *Brandenburgh*, after having passed several days with their Electoral Highnesses of *Saxony* at *Tergow*, to partake of the Publick Divertisements on the occasion of their Marriage, returned on the 10th instant to *Possdam*; on the 17th the Elector of *Brandenburgh* intends to be at *Mazdeburgh*, and the 20th
