The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg the text, in French, of an Order issued by His Imperial Majesty The Czar on the 28th ultimo, respecting Articles to be treated as Contraband of War, of which the following is a literal translation. The Russian Government further state that all the articles enumerated in Rule VI are regarded as unconditionally contraband, and the Russian Government reserve to themselves the right to supplement the list of contraband articles by the addition of others if, in the circumstances of the war they should deem it necessary to forbid the conveyance of such articles to Japan or to Japanese armed forces.

(Translation.)

An Order of His Majesty the Emperor, communicated to the Senate by the Minister of Justice, approving the Rules which the Imperial Government will enforce during the war with Japan.

His Majesty the Emperor was graciously pleased on the 14th February, 1904, to write in his own hand upon the original, "Let it be so."

Rules which the Imperial Government will enforce during the War with Japan.

I. Japanese subjects are authorized to continue, under the protection of Russian law, to reside and to follow peaceful callings in the Russian

Empire, except in the territories forming part of the Imperial Lieutenancy in the Far East.

II. Japanese merchant vessels which, at the time of the declaration of war, happened to be in Russian ports and harbours, are authorized to remain there before putting to sea with cargoes not being articles contraband of war, for such period as may be necessary in proportion to their loading requirements, but which shall in no case exceed forty-eight hours, counting from the moment that the present declaration is published by the local authorities.

III. Subjects of neutral States may continue without hindrance their commercial relations with Russian ports and towns, provided that they conform to the laws of the Empire, and to the principles of the law of nations.

IV. The military authorities are bound to take all necessary measures to secure freedom for the lawful trade of neutrals so far as is compatible with warlike operations.

V. The following Rules are to be observed with regard to neutral commerce:—

1. The neutral flag covers enemy's goods, with the exception of contraband of war.

2. Neutral goods, with the exception of contraband of war, may not be seized under the enemy's flag.

3. Blockade, in order to be binding, must be effective, that is to say, it must be maintained by a force really sufficient to prevent access to the enemy's coast.

VI. The following articles are deemed to be contraband of war:—

1. Small-arms of every kind, and guns, mounted or in sections, as well as armour-plates;

2. Ammunition for fire-arms such as projectiles, shell-fuses, bullets, priming, cartridges, cartridge-cases, powder, saltpetre, sulphur;

3. Explosives and materials for causing explosions, such as torpedoes, dynamite, pyroxyline, various explosive substances, wire conductors, and everything used to explode mines and torpedoes;

4. Artillery, engineering and camp equipment, such as gun carriages, ammunition waggons, boxes or packages of cartridges, field kitchens and forges, instrument waggons, pontoons, bridge trestles, barbed wire, harness, &c.;

5. Articles of military equipment and clothing, such as bandoliers, cartridge boxes, knapsacks, straps, cuirasses, entrenching tools, drums, pots and pans, saddles, harness, completed parts of military uniforms, tents, &c.;

6. Vessels bound for an enemy's port, even if under a neutral commercial flag, if it is apparent from their construction, interior fittings, and other indications that they have been built for warlike purposes, and are proceeding to an enemy's port in order to be sold or handed over to the enemy;

7. Boilers and every kind of naval machinery, mounted or unmounted.

8. Every kind of fuel, such as coal, naphtha, alcohol, and other similar materials.

9. Articles and material for the installation of telegraphs, telephones, or for the construction of railroads.

10. Generally, everything intended for warfare by sea or land, as well as rice, provisions and horses, beasts of burden and others which may be used for a warlike purpose, if they are transported on the account of or are destined for the enemy.

VII. The following acts, forbidden to neutrals, are assimilated to contraband of war: The transport of the enemy's troops, of his despatches and correspondence, the supply of transports and war-ships to the enemy. Neutral vessels captured

in the act of carrying contraband of this nature may, according to circumstances, be seized, and even confiscated.

VIII. The Imperial Government reserves to itself the right to depart from the above-mentioned Regulations in regard to an enemy or neutral State which, on its side, does not observe them, as well as to take the necessary measures in accordance with the special circumstances of each specific case.

IX. The detailed Regulations which the military authorities are bound to observe during naval warfare are set forth in the "Règlement" relating to prizes sanctioned by His Majesty the Emperor on the 27th March, 1895, as well as in the special instructions approved by the Admiralty Council on the 20th September, 1900, relating to stoppage, visit, capture, transport, and delivery of captured vessels and goods.

X. In addition, the military authorities are bound to conform to the following International Agreements signed by Russia:—

1. The Geneva Convention of the 10th (22nd) August, 1864, for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded in time of war.

2. The Declaration of St. Petersburg of the 29th November (11th December), 1868, respecting the prohibition of the use of explosive projectiles.

3. Agreements signed at the International Peace Conference at The Hague, the 17th (29th) July, 1899, and ratified by His Majesty the Emperor the 6th May, 1900.

(a.) Convention with respect to the laws and customs of war by land.

(b.) Convention for adapting to maritime warfare the principles of the Geneva Convention of the 10th (22nd) August, 1864.

(c.) Declaration relating to the prohibition of the use, for a period of five years, of projectiles and explosives dropped from balloons or by means of other similar new methods.

(d.) Declaration relating to the prohibition of the use of projectiles which are only intended to spread asphyxiating or noxious fumes.

(e.) Declaration relative to the prohibition of the use of bullets which expand or flatten easily in the human body, such as bullets with hard casing, of which the casing does not entirely cover the core, or is provided with notches.

**WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).**

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Hastings) Order, 1904.

Dated 9th March, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Hastings, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Hastings) Order, 1904.

**BIRDS.***Close Time extended.*

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Hastings, except with respect to the following Birds, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year:—

Curlew, Godwit, Lapwing, Mallard, Plover, Redshank and other Sandpipers, Snipe, Teal and other Wild Ducks, Wild Geese, Wild Swan, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Hastings to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hobby, Kestrel, Landrail, Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Raven, Redstart, Red Backed Shrike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtails (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

*Certain Birds protected during the whole of the  
Year.*

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Hastings:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hen Harrier (Ring-tailed Hawk), Marsh Harrier (Moor Buzzard), Montagu's Harrier, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Nightjar or Goatsucker, Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover (Stonehatch), Redpole, Raven, Siskin, Spoonbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick Knee), Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Woodlark, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

*All Birds protected on Sundays.*

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Hastings.

**Eggs.***All Eggs protected within certain Areas.*

VI. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds Eggs is prohibited for a period of three years from the date of this Order within the following areas, viz.:—The line of Cliffs within the County Borough of Hastings, and the Alexandra Park within the said County Borough.

The above areas are shown in pink on a map deposited with the Town Council, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 9th March, 1904.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Hastings:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Crossbill, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Nightingale, Nightjar, Oriole, Owl (all species), Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover (Stonehatch), Red-backed Shrike, Spoonbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick Knee),

Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Woodlark, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

VIII. The Order of the 24th February, 1903, is hereby repealed.

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Salop) Order, 1904."

BIRDS.

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the whole of the County of Salop to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nuthatch, Swallow, Swift, Treecreeper, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail.

*Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.*

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Salop:—

Kingfisher, Owl, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Siskin, Woodpecker.

EGGS.

*Certain Eggs Protected throughout the County.*

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Salop:—

Crossbill, Curlew, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Kingfisher, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Owl (all species), Shrike, Teal, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Woodpecker (all species).

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following copy of a Decree by the Provisional Government of Panama, dated February 13, 1904, declaring the Port of Pacasmayo, in Peru, to be infected with bubonic plague, and ordering that renewed measures be adopted for preventing the introduction of plague into Panama:—

(Translation.)

Decree No. 17, of the 13th February, 1904.

Ordering the adoption of preventive measures against bubonic plague.

The Provisional Government of the Republic of Panama, in the exercise of the powers with which it is invested, and in consequence of the communication No. 471, of this date, by which the Secretary of the National Board of Health makes known that the Board has decided to declare the Port of Pacasmayo, in the Republic of Peru, to be infected with the bubonic plague, decrees:

ART. 1. That vessels sailing from the Port of Pacasmayo, in the Republic of Peru, or which have touched at that port, shall be subjected to such preventive measures as the National Board of Health may dictate.

ART. 2. That the Secretary of the Board, Inspector-General of Sanitation, be authorized to re-assume the functions with which he was invested by Decree No. 123 of 1903, issued by the Government of the late Department.

ART. 3. That the agents of the Republic in Peru be called upon to furnish information, with the promptitude that the case demands, concerning the state of the epidemic in all Peruvian ports, for the purpose of enabling such steps to be taken as may be necessary for the prevention of contagion, and the consequent disturbance of the commerce of the Republic.

And whereas by an Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (3) of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by an Order dated the twenty-sixth day of January, nineteen hundred and four, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for each of the Councils of the Counties and Urban District named in the Schedule to this Order for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the first day of April, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such other purpose or provision for any such Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for each of the said Councils for all such other purposes and provisions the first day of June, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board may for any such other purpose or provision for any such Council hereafter appoint.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Altering General Out-Relief Distributor's Order (Metropolis): Appointment of Stocktaker.

SAINT OLAVE'S UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Saint Olave's Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 27th day of February, 1875, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Saint Olave's Union (amongst others), and hereinafter referred to as "the General Order," We, the Local Government Board, prescribed regulations with respect to the duties of any officer appointed by the said Guardians to take charge of and to distribute the Stores for Out-door Relief in kind, and referred to in the General Order and in this Order as the Out-Relief Distributor;

And whereas by the General Order the Out-Relief Distributor is required to keep an Account, termed in the General Order "A Quarterly Balance of the Out-Relief Distributor's Stores Account," and in this Order referred to as "the Book of Account," and the said Account relates to the provisions and stores entrusted to his care by the said Guardians, and to the consumption of the same, and the Out-Relief Distributor is required to submit the Book of Account, when made up and balanced, to the Visiting Committee or some member thereof, who shall sign the memorandum at the foot of the Book of Account after making the requisite examination;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stock of provisions and stores kept by any Out-Relief Distributor appointed by the said Guardians, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Saint Olave's Union, as and when they think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of provisions and stores kept by any Out-Relief Distributor appointed by the Guardians, and shall compare the same with the Book of Account.

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall in the Book of Account and at the foot of the Account showing the Quarterly Balance sign a certificate in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 19\_\_\_\_, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed).....

"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.—The Out-Relief Distributor shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stock and the Book of Account, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Out-Relief Distributor shall lay the Book of Account before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee, or any member of the Visiting Committee, in pursuance of the General Order, to examine the stock or to sign the memorandum shown in the Form F in the Schedule to the General Order.

And whereas the Right Reverend Ernest Roland Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester as diocesan and as patron in right of his See of the rectory and vicarage of the said parish of Selsey, and the Reverend John Cavis-Brown as Incumbent of the said rectory and vicarage, have by an Instrument under their hands bearing date on or about the fourth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, certified to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Selsey that the said new church of Saint Peter, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (also dedicated to Saint Peter of the same parish).

Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument, under our common seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Ernest Roland Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester, and of the said John Cavis-Brown, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Peter, situate within the said parish of Selsey and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Peter as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Selsey, in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint Peter, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Peter so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same parish. And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do

hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Peter as aforesaid) of the said parish of Selsey, or of or belonging to the Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Peter (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said parish of Selsey), and to the Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

*Uniform System of Buoyage.*

1. Buoys or beacons marking the port side of a channel, harbour, or river are cylindrical or

square in shape, and painted black. If surmounted by a topmark, that also will be square and black.

2. Buoys or beacons marking the starboard side of the channel are conical or pyramidal in shape, and painted red. If surmounted by a topmark, that also will be conical and red.

3. Buoys or beacons marking middle grounds, which may be passed on either side, are spherical in shape, and painted in black and white horizontal bands. If surmounted by a topmark, that also will be spherical and painted in black and white horizontal bands.

4. Beacons marking rocks, and those marking the coast which it is not necessary to see at any distance, consist of posts surmounted by topmarks, of the form, and painted the colour according to the position they occupy with respect to the channel, or harbour in which they are placed. The shape and colour of the leading beacons also corresponds with the position in which they are situated in a channel or harbour.

5. Wrecks are marked by a spherical or, in default of this, a cylindrical buoy painted green, with or without a topmark.

6. Mooring buoys for quarantine are painted yellow, and those for vessels carrying explosives, red. If one buoy is used for both purposes it will be painted red.

The name of the danger which it marks is painted in large white letters on the buoy.

The form of the beacons and buoys is more important than the colour, as the colour of beacons may vary to suit the background against which they are seen. The shape of the topmarks is of greater importance than the shape of the beacons or buoys.

The port side denotes that side which is on the left hand of the mariner either going with the main stream or flood, or entering a harbour, river, or estuary from seaward; the starboard side denotes the right hand of the mariner under similar circumstances. These terms apply to all harbours and channels, including those in Magellan Strait, but in the main channel of that strait and in the Patagonian channels the terms port hand and starboard refer to a vessel passing through from the Atlantic to the Pacific.

## BARROW-IN-FURNESS TRAMWAYS.

**B**YE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the British Electric Traction Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), under the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Barrow-in-Furness Tramways Orders, 1884 and 1903.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, provided that in the



case of a carriage known as a "demi-car" every passenger shall enter or depart from such carriage by the front or driver's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No person shall smoke inside any carriage or any compartment of a carriage not specially provided for that purpose. (Any person offending against this Bye-law is liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed at the first opportunity from the carriage.)

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. No person shall expectorate in or upon any carriage.

6. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

9. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or on any carriage, and may be prevented from entering or mounting in or on any carriage, and shall not enter or mount in or on any carriage, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or on any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

10. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey.

11. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

12. Any ticket for the time being issued by the Company in respect of fares shall only be available for the carriage on or for which it is issued (except in the case of transfer or season tickets) and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any carriage for any purpose whatever at any stage, and resume his journey by a different carriage to that on or for which such ticket was issued, without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other carriage.

13. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket, so as to render the number, or any material portion thereof, illegible.

14. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not

available, or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey.

15. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

16. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

17. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

18. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of the carriage, or travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

19. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

20. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any carriage with loaded fire-arms, or with any article, instrument or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

23. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

24. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each and every such offence.

26. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company and having charge of a carriage.

27. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

28. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 20th day of April, 1904.
