ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 19TH MARCH 1904.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall apply to the Districts and part of a District described in the Schedule to this Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of March, nineteen hundred and four.
