The KING has been graciously pleased to give directions for the following appointment to the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George:—

To be an Ordinary Member of the Second Class, or Knights Commanders of the said Most Distinguished Order:—

The Right Honourable Charles Hardinge, C.V.O., C.B., His Majesty's Ambassador-designate to His Majesty the Emperor of Russia.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (Session Two), chapter twenty-six duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the tenth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (Session Two) chapter twenty-six, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your

Majesty in Council, the following scheme for rebuilding (with certain sanitary and other improvements) the episcopal house of residence belonging to the Bishoprick of Saint David's, and situate in the parish of Abergwili, in the county of Carmarthen.

"Whereas the said episcopal house of residence was destroyed by fire on the twenty-eighth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, and in respect of the loss or damage so incurred, a sum of eight thousand four hundred pounds has been paid to us under the insurance whereby the said episcopal house of residence had been insured against loss or damage by fire.

"And whereas the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Saint David's, is desirous of rebuilding the said episcopal house of residence with certain sanitary and other improvements, and has submitted to us the particulars of such proposed rebuilding and improvements and we have approved the same.

"And whereas the moneys which will be available from the moneys paid to us under the said insurance and from the interest which has accrued in respect of such moneys will be insufficient for the purpose of defraying the cost of the said proposed rebuilding and improvements.

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said proposed rebuilding and improvements a sum of two thousand pounds (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by the borrowing of such sum by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the said Bishoprick of Saint David's.

Now therefore with the consent of the said John Bishop of Saint David's (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that

the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding two thousand pounds and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of thirty-five years or until the said sum to be borrowed as aforesaid with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the following manner that is to say during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one thirtieth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months computed as aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid and that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and shall bind as well the said John now Bishop of Saint David's as every succeeding Bishop of Saint David's until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed rebuilding of the episcopal house of residence aforesaid and the said sanitary and other improvements thereto.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Bishop of Saint David's for the time being shall insure against loss or damage by fire and keep insured the said episcopal house of residence situate at Abergwili as aforesaid the said insurance to be for a sum of not less than ten thousand pounds and to be effected in one or more of the public offices of insurance in London or Westminster to be approved by us and that in case of loss or damage by fire to the same episcopal

house of residence the moneys receivable in respect of the said insurance shall be paid over to us by the said Bishop and shall with any interest or accumulations thereon be applied by us in rebuilding or repairing the same episcopal house of residence with the concurrence of the said Bishop.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein-named Acts or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Charles Bishop of Worcester acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has affixed his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward Vine Hall acting as vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Bromsgrove as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Blockley and the church

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, and of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, both in the county of York, and in the diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the tenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and published in the London Gazette on the seventh day of March following, a certain portion of the parish of Almondbury, in the said county of York, and at that time in the diocese of Ripon, but now in the said diocese of Wakefield, was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint David, situate at Holmebridge, in the said parish of Almondbury, and the said chapelry district was named 'The Chapelry District of Saint David, Holmebridge.'

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Saint David, Holmebridge, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the seventh day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-eighth day of the same month, a certain part of the parish of Kirkburton, in the said county of York, and at that time in the said diocese of Ripon, but now in the said diocese of Wakefield, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity, situate at Holmfirth, in the said parish of Kirkburton, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, has under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the above-mentioned Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, and of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, and of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, shall be altered so that firstly all that portion of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, which is described in the first schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new

parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, and secondly all that portion of the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, which is described in the second schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Wakefield, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, which is bounded upon the north-west, upon the west, upon the south-west, and upon the south-east, by the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, at the junction of Ramsden-road with Cartworth Moor-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Cartworth Moor-road for a distance of one mile and twelve chains or thereabouts to the point where Cartworth Moor-road is intersected by the road which leads from Cartworth towards Hill House, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the point where such road branches south-westward to Hill House and north-eastward to Nether Hill House, and extending thence north-westward and in a straight line for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of White Gate-road with the roadway leading past the house called Old Yew to Royd-lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Royd-lane opposite to the point where such lane is joined by the footpath leading between Malkin House Wood and Bray Wood to Bottoms Mill, and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the said Malkin House Wood, and extending thence north-eastward along the said boundary wall or fence for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the south-eastern bank of the river Holme, and extending thence in a straight line north-westward to a point in the middle of the said river Holme, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, from the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dis severed from the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, and to be annexed to the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, being:

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the south by the parish of Woodhead, in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester, upon the south-east by the parish of Penistone, upon the east partly by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, and partly by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Hepworth, in the said county of York, and diocese of Wakefield, upon the north-east by the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, from the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, at the junction of Cartworth Moor-road with Ramsden-road, and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Ramsden-road) for a distance of thirty-one chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of such road opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of Crossley's Plantation, and extending thence south-westward to, and then first south-westward and afterwards south-eastward along, the said wall or fence (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Holmfirth, from the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge,) for a distance of thirty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to the south-western corner of the said plantation, where the last-mentioned boundary turns south-westward, and extending thence south-westward and then southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary approaches the eastern side of the stream called or known as Ramsden Clough, and extending thence westward to, and then first southward and afterwards south-westward along, such stream for a distance of seventy-five chains or thereabouts to the point where the course of the said stream changes from eastward to north-eastward, and extending thence due southward and in a straight line for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint David, Holmebridge, from the said parish of Woodhead."

Hearsall Ward.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, enclosing the following translations of a Royal Decree of the 19th ultimo, and of a Ministerial Decree of the 4th instant, enacting for the coming year certain measures to be taken in Holland for the prevention of plague.

Translation.

(Staatsblad No. 47) Decree of the 19th February, 1904, enacting certain extraordinary measures for protection against the plague and for the prevention of its spread and consequences.

We, Wilhelmina, by the Grace of God Queen of the Netherlands, Princess of Orange-Nassau, &c., &c., &c.

Considering that, owing to the appearance of plague in divers places abroad, it is necessary to give effect to the law of 26th April, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 80), supplemented by the law of 20th July, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 164), and amended by Article 19 of the law of 15th April, 1886 (Staatsblad No. 64), for the enactment of extraordinary measures for protection against certain infectious diseases and for the prevention of their spread and consequences;

On the proposal of Our Minister of Home Affairs, of 14th January, 1904, No. 367, Division, Home Administration.

Having heard the Council of State (advice of the 9th of February, 1904, No. 17);

Having regard to the further report of Our Minister of Home Affairs, of 16th February, 1904, No. 1191, Division, Home Administration;

Have given Our approval and assent to the following:—

ARTICLE I.

The following are forbidden, except by permission of Our Minister of Home Affairs and subject to the due observance of the directions which shall be given by him for the prevention of the spread of infection;

1°. The examination of persons and goods, to detect the presence of infectious matter, by means of experiments on animals;

2°. The performance of autopsy of bodies of persons who have died from plague or who are suspected to have been suffering from plague;

3°. The removal of matter which is known or suspected to be infectious.

ARTICLE II.

This decree, which shall remain in force for one year, shall come into operation on the second day after the date of the Staatsblad and of the Staatscourant in which it is inserted.

Our Minister of Home Affairs is charged with the execution of this decree, which shall be inserted in the Staatsblad and simultaneously in the Staatscourant, and a copy of which shall be sent to the Council of State.

The Minister of Home Affairs;

Considering that, by the terms of the Royal Decree of 19th February, 1904 (Staatsblad No. 47), which takes the place of the Royal Decree of 9th December, 1902 (Staatsblad No. 215), the following are forbidden, except by permission of the Minister of Home Affairs and subject to the due observance of the directions which shall be given by him for the prevention of the spread of infection:

1°. The examination of persons and goods, to detect the presence of infectious matter, by means of experiments on animals;

2°. The performance of autopsy of bodies of persons who have died from plague or who are suspected to have been suffering from plague;

3°. The removal of matter which is known or suspected to be infectious;

Having perused the advice of the Inspectors for Medical State-supervision, of 16th May, 1900;

Has resolved to appoint as follows:

§ 1. *Examination of persons and goods, to detect the presence of infectious matter, by means of experiments on animals.*

Applications for permission to perform such an examination may be made to the Inspector, charged under the Health Law with the supervision of the maintenance of the provisions of law concerning infectious diseases, in whose district of inspection it is desired to perform the examination.

Applications must be accompanied by all possible information concerning the arrangement of the locality where the examination is to be held, and the precautions to be taken, in connection with the examination, against the dissemination of infectious matter.

It must be shown, inter alia, what precautions the applicant has taken:

(a) To render the locality where the examination is to be performed secure against the entry of persons whose presence at the examination is not required and of animals which are not used in the examination;

(b) To prevent the escape of animals used for experimental purposes;

(c) To insure that the destruction of the animals used, &c., shall be properly carried out;

(d) To enable persons, clothing, and objects to be effectively disinfected.

Furthermore it must be stated what persons are to be present at the examination, and information must be given as to the capability, experience, precision, and trustworthiness of the persons who are to assist in the examination.

The Inspector shall forward the application to the Minister of Home Affairs as quickly as possible (if necessary, by telegraph), adding thereto his own advice.

§ 2. *The performance of autopsy of bodies of persons who have died from plague, or who are suspected to have been suffering from plague.*

Applications for permission to perform such autopsy may be made to the Inspector, charged under the Health Law with the supervision of the maintenance of the provisions of law concerning infectious diseases, in whose district of inspection it is desired to perform the autopsy.

Applications must be accompanied by all possible information concerning:

(a) The manner in which matter derived from the body will be kept out of reach of animals which may disseminate infectious matter;

(b) The manner in which the said matter will be collected and rendered innocuous;

(c) The precautions against dissemination of infection which are to be taken by those who perform the autopsy and by those who assist thereat.

The application shall be dealt with in the same way as that referred to in § 1.

§ 3. *Removal of matter which is known or suspected to be infectious.*

The removal of such matter without escort, by any means of transport, is not permitted.

The removal is allowed when it is conducted personally by a Member of the Central Board of Health, by an Inspector charged under the Health Law with the supervision of the maintenance of the provisions of law concerning infectious diseases, by a Professor-Director of a pathologic, hygienic or pharmaceutical laboratory, by a medical practitioner or by a person possessing a special authorization in writing for the purpose from a Member of the Central Board of Health, Inspector, Professor, or medical practitioner as above, provided always;

(a) That the matter to be examined be placed in a well-stoppered bottle, which shall be so closed as to be water-tight, carefully enveloped in some absorbent packing and packed in a closely-shutting wooden box;

(b) The package bear a clear address, in which must appear also the word "smetstof" in clearly legible characters.

This decree shall be inserted in the "Nederlandsche Staatscourant."

SHOEBURYNNESS MILITARY TRAMWAY EXTENSION.

Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the Military Tramways Act, 1887, authorizing one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State to construct and maintain an extension of the Shoeburyness Military Tramway in the parishes of Great Wakering and Foulness.

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1904, and the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1893, the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order (1893) Amendment Order, 1896, and this Order may be cited together as the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Orders, 1893 to 1904.

Construction.

2.—(1.) This Order shall be construed as one with Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1893.

(2.) In this Order the expressions "the deposited plan" and "the deposited section" mean respectively the plan and section deposited in respect of this Order with the Board of Trade, and signed by an Assistant Secretary of the Board, and the expression "principal Order" means the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1893, as amended by the Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order (1893) Amendment Order, 1896.

Tramway Authorized.

3.—(1.) Subject to the provisions of this Order and of the principal Order applied by this Order, the Secretary of State may construct on land belonging to him and across the Wakering Stairs road, and in the line and according to the levels shown in the deposited plan and deposited section, the tramway hereinafter described, with all works necessary or suitable to the use or working thereof, and may maintain, work, and use the same.

(2.) The tramway authorized by this Order is a tramway 132·22 chains in length, commencing at a point on the tramway already constructed under the principal Order and marked A on the deposited plan, and thence for the most part in an easterly direction to a point marked C on the deposited plan, and thence in two branches to the firing platforms marked E and F on the deposited plan.

(3.)
